Monday, January 1

This has been a beautiful New Years day. I made 102 Platinum prints.

Kate was painting all day.

Tuesday, Jan. 2

There were filmy clouds all today and tonight it looks very much like a coming snow storm. I went to Ann Arbor on the noon train from Delhi. Took dinner with the Cushmans as Elmer is home now. I did a number of errands and came home on the train tonight. Mr. Bayliss, the preacher, is here tonight. Dewey is quite sick with a cold.

Wednesday, Jan. 3

Mr. Bayliss and I went to the lake this morning to see how strong the ice was and found it about 3 inches thick. It began to rain soon and kept it up all day. Tonight it is blowing up like a change and is clearing off. I mounted up a number of paintings.

Thursday, Jan. 4 Ther.: 28+

A heavy wind from the south west and heavy snow squalls making a disagreeable day.

I wrote some letters and ordered a renewal to the Youths Companion for Nellie.

Sawed and split some wood for exercise.

Friday, Jan. 5 Ther.: 32+

I went to Dexter this forenoon to do a lot of errands. When I got home I drove down for Maude Williams so she could be at our social tonight which was a success as there were about 45 folks here. There were squalls of snow but it was not cold.

Saturday, Jan. 6 Ther.: 26+

It has been a howler today, the wind blew a gale and flurries of snow in the air. I drove to Ed Marts this afternoon to return the dishes and chairs borrowed of the farmers club.

We had a choir practice here this afternoon.

The moon is very bright tonight.

Sunday, Jan. 7 Ther.: 22+, 16+

Fairly pleasant winter day. We all went to church today and I sang in the choir as I did years ago, but none of the old choir are here now.

Don took dinner with us and Edwin Ball and wife called tonight to see mother as she intends to go to Cleveland tomorrow.

It is becoming somewhat sharply cold tonight.

Monday, Jan. 8 Ther.: 14+, 2+, 12+

Pretty cold today.

I drove up to Dexter this morning taking Nellie to school and mother to the train as she started for Cleveland. Will went down to Detroit with her. This afternoon I went to Ralph Williams' to look at and buy a young hog.

It cleared up and is cold tonight.

Tuesday, Jan. 9 Ther.: 14+, 26+, 22+

Grew a little warmer today. The sun shone and I did a good batch of Platinum prints.

I cleaned out two chimneys so I guess there will be no danger of their burning out this winter.

Wednesday, Jan. 10 Ther.: 20+, 34+

Another fine day and I made a large batch of prints.

Will came down this morning and he and John Bird sawed up wood in the north woods.

Kate went to Dexter with Will tonight and she and Millie are to join the Eastern Stars tonight.

Thursday, Jan. 11 Ther.: 34+

Very mild weather and wind in the south all day. Will and Millicent were here at supper and then drove home.

We had a young hog die of cholera tonight and it may kill all we have now.

I printed some pictures in spite of the clouds.

Friday, Jan. 12

Been a very mild day and thawed some.

I worked at the photo printing.

Nellie came home from Dexter this afternoon, driving the rig Will took up last night.

Saturday, Jan. 13

It was cloudy all today, but not cold.

I did no photo printing today.

Had a letter from mother today.

Sunday, Jan. 14 Ther.: 37+

It drizzled some last night and this morning. We all went to church. Don took dinner with us.

Monday, Jan. 15 Ther.: 48+

Showery all day and quite warm, wind rising tonight with prospect of colder spell.

I went to Dexter this morning to take Nellie to school and do a few errands. Will came back with me.

Tuesday, Jan. 16 Ther.: 34+, 30+, 26+

Ground covered with soft snow this morning. It has blown a gale all day and snowed some. The mail carrier was about 3 hours late because of hard traveling.

Will went back to Dexter this afternoon.

It is colder tonight.

Wednesday, Jan. 17 Ther.: 29+, 28+

Cloudy all day and a snow storm from the east raging tonight.

I signed, marked and sorted a lot of the painted sketches today.

Kate and Ida Kenny were at Mrs. Lew Bennett's this afternoon.

Thursday, Jan. 18 Ther.: 32+, 36+

Been several snow squalls today and there were some sleighs running about.

It grew warmer again.

Mounted and signed more pictures.

Dewey had earache again. He has not been able to go to school this week.

Friday, Jan. 19 Ther.: 28+, 32+

Looked over and sorted most all the apples in the cellar this forenoon.

Went to Dexter for Nellie and the laundry this afternoon. Mabel Kenny rode out with us. It seems very storm like tonight.

Saturday, Jan. 20 Ther.: 63+

Been the warmest day of the winter.

Will came out and drew a load of wood up to his home. The sun came out and I did some printing.

Went down to Maude's and practiced some songs tonight.

Sunday, Jan. 21 Ther.: 63+

Real warm again today. None of us went to church and there were so few they held no service.

Don came over and was here at lunch tonight.

It rained all the forenoon and seems like it again tonight. Dewey still has bad feelings in his ears and is quite deaf.

Monday, Jan. 22 *Ther.:* 62+, 38+

Rained considerable last night. I went to Dexter with the team this morning to take the milk, Nellie and the washing. It rained while I was there but I was at Will's. Finished pruning grape vines by the house and also pruned all the trees in the young orchard this afternoon. It grew much cooler this afternoon.

Tuesday, Jan. 23 Ther.: 32+, 30+

Some slight snow squalls this morning.

It has grown cooler.

Will came at noon and he and John are sawing wood.

Kate went to a Minstrel concert at Dexter tonight with Don.

Wednesday, Jan. 24 Ther.: 26+

Frozen up this morning. It has been quite pleasant all day. I made 120 photo prints.

Will went home tonight, but rode a horse so as to come down tomorrow.

Dewey started to school again this afternoon.

Thursday, Jan. 25

Wind from the east all day and looked stormy till toward night it cleared up. I did some printing for large paintings.

Will and John continued cutting wood.

Friday, Jan. 26

Fine pleasant day.

I drove up to Dexter and put my horse out at Will's barn. Had dinner with uncle John and aunt Ann. Put in considerable time studying masonry with uncle John. Showed a sample lot of our paintings to several friends.

Mabel Kenny rode home with me and Grace and the teacher there came for her and all spent the evening here.

Saturday, Jan. 27 Ther.: 40+ Grew warmer today.

Will and John Bird worked at the wood till noon.

I made a large batch of photo prints.

Kate and Dewey took a ride and went down to see Mrs. Otis Cushing's toward night.

Sunday, Jan. 28

Cloudy this morning and seemed stormy, but it cleared off very nice this afternoon.

Kate, Dewey and I went up to Dexter after church and had dinner with Will and his folks. Jay McColl's wife and baby were here from Detroit and we had a nice time.

Monday, Jan. 29 Ther.: 40+

Frozen in the road this morning but it warmed up and thawed later in the day. I took Nellie up to Dexter this morning.

John Bird told me this morning that he was going to quit his job here so I am badly out in my dealing with him. The farm and all the chores come back on my hands Feb. 1.

Sawed up some wood this afternoon.

Tuesday, Jan. 30

Will came out today and has been drawing up some wood for us. It has been a dull day, but I got over 90 prints made.

Wednesday, Jan. 31 Ther.: 22+

It was more like winter this morning, but not severely cold.

Will came down and we drew wood this forenoon. I walked down to Wheelers this afternoon to settle with Gene and get the things he had repaired. Tomorrow morning I have all the chores back on my hands again.

Thursday, February 1 Ther.: 30+, 5+

A couple of inches of snow this morning made things look wintry. It was mild though and almost rained, then grew cold and then was many snow squalls during the day. The Farmers institute was held at the church today and Kate was working at the school house helping get dinner and supper. I took the chores over on to my own hands this morning. Was up to hear the speaking tonight at the church. Will and Nellie are staying here. It has grown very cold.

Friday, Feb. 2 Ther.: 4, 10+

Coldest of the winter this morning. The sun shone so the ground hog could see his shadow all right. Will and Nellie went home this forenoon and Nellie drove the rig back tonight.

I spent the day in doing chores and keeping up fires.

We had a call from Horace Sayles this afternoon.

Went to Maude's to practice singing tonight.

Saturday, Feb. 3 Ther.: 3+, 21+, 32+

Sharply cold this morning and the wind has blown a gale all day, but it has grown steadily warmer.

I went to Delhi this forenoon for Millpeed.

Sawed up some wood and did chores.

Sunday, Feb. 4 Ther.: 34+, 26+, 20+

Quite moderate this morning, but growing colder. We all went to church. Don took dinner with us.

Monday, Feb. 5 Ther.: 0, 8+, 2+

Stinging cold.

Don came and took Nellie up to Dexter this morning.

Did little today but the chores. So cold I wanted to be in the house most of the time. Will came down about noon and was cutting wood this afternoon. He is staying here tonight.

Tuesday, Feb. 6 *Ther.:* 1-, 12+, 4+

Cold continues.

I walked up to Dexter this forenoon and took dinner with uncle John and aunt Ann. Was studying masonry under uncle John. I met Will walking home as I came back this afternoon.

I saw a very beautiful meteor in the North east tonight.

Wednesday, Feb. 7 Ther.: 4, 18+, 8+

Wrote a letter to mother this forenoon.

It was very cold this morning.

I sawed some wood this afternoon.

Kate went to Dexter to her lodge meeting tonight.

Thursday, Feb. 8 Ther.: 4+, 29+

Eclipse of the moon tomorrow morning.

Grew moderate today. Will drew a load of wood up to his home. Kate was at Steptoes this forenoon and has gove over to spend the night. Eddie is very sick.

I am so sleepy I fear I will not wake to see the eclipse after midnight.

Friday, Feb. 9

Did nothing much today but chores and odd jobs, and studying to take my third masonic degree tonight.

Don came over to supper and took me up to Dexter. I went to the Lodge with Uncle John Spoor. The new Temple is in use now, and I was the first man to be initiated in the same[?].

It grows colder tonight.

I saw the eclipse at 2:30 last night.

Saturday, Feb. 10 Ther.: 8+, 12+

Kate went to Steptoes this forenoon to see how Eddie was and to take them a little something. When she came back she took Dewey and Nellie and went on the Latson's to the meeting of the Farmers club. I wrote some letters and ordered more photo material. It has been a fine winter day.

Sunday, Feb. 11 Ther.: 5+, 26+

It grew warmer today. I had a toothache and so did not go to church. Don came down and took dinner with us.

We expect mother home tomorrow night.

Monday, Feb. 12 Ther.: 48+

A very nice pleasant day. I made platinum prints this forenoon. Will came down just at noon to be here tonight to do the chores. I went to Ann Arbor this afternoon to meet ma at the train form Toledo. We got home just at dark.

Tuesday, Feb. 13 Ther.: 40+

We have talked over today about Will taking the farm, and I think now it is likely he will, and we probable move to Dexter. It began to rain this afternoon and tonight it is raining quite hard.

Wednesday, Feb. 14 Ther.: 12+, 14+, 7+

It turned cold during last night and has been windy all today. Will came down this forenoon and will stay over tonight.

Kate has painted and I have mounted some of the large pictures.

Thursday, Feb. 15 Ther.: 2-, 14+, 12+

Biting cold this morning. I did up some paintings to send to Asheville and took them up to Dexter to express. I walked up and had dinner with uncle John and aunt Ann. I made arrangements so we can rent the house Will is now

in if we wish to and I went to look at a house on this side of the river. Will drove back home tonight. Kate was away making candy for the Masonic Fair.

Friday, Feb. 16 Ther.: 4+

Pretty cold this morning, but it has warmed up today and seems quite moderate.

I began printing on some special work for the Toxaway Hotel Co. Will hauled up wood for himself this afternoon.

Kate went to Dexter to get Nellie and the washing.

Saturday, Feb. 17

Been a mild day.

I printed a lot of photos on Platino.

Will did not come down today.

There was a surprise party at Balls tonight and Kate and I went down.

Sunday, Feb. 18

Cloudy all day with chilly south west wind, a little mist and a few flakes of snow. I went to Dexter and had dinner with Will and his folks. We talked over the matter of his renting the farm and I believe it is now decided on.

Monday, Feb. 19 Ther.: 42

Grown quite warmer today. I wrote several letters this forenoon so did no picture work till after dinner. Will was here most all day. Edwin Ball, Bert Kenny and Frank Wheeler came this afternoon and appraised the personal property as Will wants to buy it of mother.

Tuesday, Feb. 20 Ther.: 50+

Warm day for winter.

It rained some this afternoon.

Did some photo printing this forenoon.

Kate, Dewey and Miss Cullinam went up to see Eddie Steptoe.

We killed 3 hens tonight to cook for a Missionary dinner here Thursday.

Wednesday, Feb. 21 Ther.: 35+

Continues warm and the mud is getting very deep and bad.

I finished Platino photos today.

I am very tired tonight.

Thursday, Feb. 22

Been a mild, nice day, but the mud is getting very bad in the roads.

A missionary meeting of the ladies was held here today and our folks served dinner. I was kept busy with the horses.

Friday, Feb. 23

Continues soft and warm. I made blue prints today and had rather bad luck with them. Kate, mother and Dewey went to the Masonic Fair in Dexter tonight.

Kate and Nellie came home but mother and Dewey got scared at the dark night and stayed at Will's.

Saturday, Feb. 24

Nellie went to Dexter and got mother and Dewey this forenoon. The roads are fearful muddy. I finished pruning grape vines.

It is warm weather.

We have a thunder and lightning rain storm on hand tonight.

Sunday, Feb. 25

It grew cooler today and there were some snow squalls making a disagreeable day of it.

Monday, Feb. 26 Ther.: 20+

Kate took Nellie to Dexter this morning and expressed the albums to Lake Toxaway that I just completed. Will came back with her and is staying tonight. I finished a batch of platino prints this afternoon. The wind is north and quite cold.

Tuesday, Feb. 27 *Ther.:* 16+, 22+

Quite cold all day with a sort of blizzard in the air all forenoon.

I worked all day at making blue prints.

Kate painted all day on the pictures.

Wednesday, Feb. 28

Quite cloudy all day so that I did no printing but I put up Folders and did odd work.

Mother went to Mrs. Kenny's and spent most of the day.

Will was working at his wood. He went home tonight.

Thursday, March 1

It has grown warmer today and seems like storming tonight.

Made Blue Prints again today.

John Cushing took dinner with us.

Will telephoned that he was sick and could not come down.

Friday, March 2

Did up photos to mail to the Smiths at Highlands, N.C.

Kate and ma went to Dexter this afternoon and had to come home in a rain storm. It is raining and freezing on to everything it touches tonight.

Saturday, March 3

It rained hard during last night and most of this forenoon. Toward night it was cooler and squalled snow. I did some developing and took some new negatives of Dewey.

Sunday, March 4 Ther.: 26+

Been rather blustery all day. The ground is white with a thin snow tonight.

Don came over this evening to bring some things for Nellie.

Monday, March 5

Kate drove to Dexter this morning to take Nellie and the washing. Will came down and drew a load of wood to Dexter this afternoon for us. The sun came out and I did considerable blue printing.

Tuesday, March 6

Cloudy all day.

I worked at triming and mounting paintings. Will drew two loads of wood up town for us.

Dewey has another very bad cold.

Wednesday, March 7

Will took one load of wood up today.

We are all busy picking up things and getting ready to move.

Cloudy still ad moderate weather.

Thursday, March 8

The folks took up some carpets today.

I did some packing.

It was almost misty all day.

Friday, March 9

Will went to Dexter with wood this forenoon. We are all working at sorting and packing our things in getting ready to move to Dexter. The ground was white with snow this morning but it melted before night.

Been cloudy all day. Dewey had to stay home from school because of his cold.

The above is a day ahead. Will took a load of goods and brought one of his back.

Saturday, March 10

I took Will to Dexter and carried up some of our canned fruit this morning. Got back in time to go to the Farmers Club meeting at Edwin Ball's home.

I did not stay to the exercises as I had so much to see to at home.

The ground is white with snow again.

Sunday, March 11

Been a little fine snow in the air all day. We all went to church.

Don came and had chicken dinner with us.

We expect to push the moving tomorrow.

Monday, March 12 Ther.: 17+

Quite cold again.

Don came with a team and wagon and he and I took two loads of goods up to Dexter and brought two back for Will.

Tuesday, March 13

Will and Don brought a load each of goods for us and Kate and I came in the buggy. We all had lunch at Will's then Millie drove home with the buggy and ma and Dewey came up so we have begun living in Dexter tonight. The folks are all tired and mother and Dewey are homesick. I hope when we get settled they will feel all right. Quite a snow storm was on this evening.

Wednesday, March 14

Been a chilly day.

I went out this forenoon and helped Will set up his cook stove, and this afternoon I brought up a load of chairs etc. and took the last of Will's things back. Walked into town after supper. The folks are getting things quite ship shape and house waling[?].

Thursday, March 15 Ther.: 14+

Been helping settle the house some today by putting up a stove in the dining room and taking out and putting back the coal stove.

Will was up to dinner as he brought a load of goods for Lew Bennett.

It was sharply cold this morning.

Friday, March 16 Ther.: 18+

I walked out to the old home this morning and brought a load of wood up. It was a chilly wind and disagreeable day to be on the road. I brought a horse and carriage home tonight.

Attended lodge tonight.

Saturday, March 17 Ther.: 11+

Pretty cold morning.

I took Jennie McColl out to Will's this morning. Loaded a wagon with wood and brought up this afternoon. It had become windy and was very disagreeable, and I caught a bad cold in my teeth so that they pain me badly tonight.

Sunday, March 18

Felt very miserable all day from toothache and a sort of general cold. Kate is feeling badly too. Will called a minute this afternoon as he has been up to a little musical practice.

The folks went to church today.

It is much warmer.

Monday, March 19

A snow storm was raging this morning and has kept at it all day. It is the worst we have had this winter. Dewey was sick all last night and was not able to begin school today.

Kate and Nellie have gone to a show at the Opera House tonight.

Tuesday, March 20

Quite pleasant today. I did some writing and mailing of pictures this forenoon and then went at making Blue Prints.

Tonight it is acting like a coming Blizzard.

Wednesday, March 21 Ther.: 14+

Quite cold this morning.

I spent the day at photo work.

There came up regular blizzard late this afternoon and the flying snow was blinding.

Kate and mother went to a missionary meeting this afternoon.

Thursday, March 22 Ther.: 4+, 11+

Cold this morning.

I made a large batch of Blue Prints.

Kate began to do painting again.

Dewey went to school today for the first time here in Dexter.

Friday, March 23 Ther.: 4+

Cold this morning.

Continued making Blue Prints but am short on paper.

Saturday, March 24 Ther.: 9+

Grew warmer today.

I spent the morning in writing letters and doing up pictures to send away.

Mounted a lot of paintings this afternoon.

Will and Millie called a little while this afternoon.

Don came up tonight and is staying with us.

Sunday, March 25 Ther.: 20+

We all went to church this forenoon.

I took Dewey down by the railroad to see a couple of fast trains go through.

It has been thawing fast today and there are patches of bare ground to be seen.

Monday, March 26

Several quite hard showers today. The robins sing like approaching spring.

I printed and finished a small batch of a new kind of paper.

Called at uncle John Spoor's a little while tonight.

Tuesday, March 27

Cloudy all day and quite warm. Will came up to get his new horse.

Spent the day triming and mounting pictures.

Wednesday, March 28

Pleasant day.

I built some shelves for Kate's clothes press and then set up my shelves in the room I have to store my things. Ma went out with Edwin Ball this afternoon to stay in Webster a day or two.

We all went to the Methodist church tonight and had our supper.

Thursday, March 29

Kate went out to Balls with Mrs. Bennett to attend the Missionary meeting and dinner. I trimed and mounted paintings all day.

I went to a very nice concert at the opera house tonight.

Friday, March 30

Kate and I went to Ann Arbor to do trading today.

We had dinner at Aunt Hannah Price's. It has grown cooler and real windy.

Saturday, March 31 Ther.: 27+

Frozen up pretty hard this morning. I made a lot of Blue Prints today. Prof. Harvey came tonight to spend Sunday with us.

Sunday, April 1 Ther.: 26+

Kate's birthday.

Have had a good visit with Prof. Harvey today.

Attended the congregational church this forenoon and the Baptist this evening.

It has been a very fine day.

Monday, April 2

Prof. Harvey left this morning for his home at Hillsdale. I did more mounting of paintings and sent off by mail the last of the work I have done for the Smiths at Highlands, N.C.

Don came up tonight and he and Nellie are going to start for Howell and other points tomorrow.

Tuesday, April 3

I walked out to the old place this morning and sawed some wood, then this afternoon I brought a load up home. I walked back to Dexter after supper tonight. It has been a nice, warm day.

Wednesday, April 4

I drove a horse and buggy to Ann Arbor this forenoon to take uncle John Spoor down to the pension medical examiner. It rained a little on us as we went down but it cleared up this afternoon and is cooler tonight. We all had supper at the cong. Church.

Thursday, April 5

Been a cloudy day with some rain and tonight quite a soft snow squall. I did some platinum work.

Friday, April 6

Sorted, signed and marked up a lot of pictures and sent a large number off to the Toxaway Inn. Took a walk down by the river with Dewey this afternoon. Will came up tonight and ma went home with him.

Saturday, April 7

It has been warm and pleasant all day. I did some printing this forenoon. Kate, Dewey and I went calling tonight going to Backers and Doanes.

Sunday, April 8

It has rained more or less all day.

Kate Dewey went to church but stayed at home and wrote letters. Don brought Nellie home this afternoon.

I called on uncle John this afternoon to study Masonry.

Dewey has the earache again this evening.

Monday, April 9

I went out to the old home this morning, riding most of the way with Alonzo Oleaver. I spent most of the day in fixing up Dewey's broken wagon. I drove back home tonight and brought mother. Dewey and Kate went down town with me tonight and Dewey got paint to use on his wagon. Received a check and good word from Asheville about our pictures we sent there to be sold.

Tuesday, April 10

Got up early and drove out to Will's. We sawed up a Buzz pile of wood and got through early in the afternoon. I called on Maude and her mother and Edwin Balls folks, then went and had supper with Ida and aunt Delia. John Cushing and Mr. McColl are at Will's tonight.

Wednesday, April 11

Will went to Hamburg with his fat hogs this forenoon. I looked over all the apples and sorted them over, then I went to the woods and piled up some wood so it will keep. This afternoon I pruned one apple tree. Came home this evening. Dewey has painted his wagon and it looks a bright red.

Thursday, April 12

Been a warm, bright day. I made over 100 platinum prints. Did up and sent some paintings to J. H. Law, Asheville, N.C.

Kate and I called on Ed. Phelps and wife tonight.

Friday, April 13

Another nice day. I made 140 Platinum prints. There came up a thunderstorm this evening while mother and Dewey were down town.

Nellie went home with Lizzie Steptoe after school.

Saturday, April 14

It rained all last night and for a while this morning, then it cleared up and was quite a fine day. I finished up the last of my Platinum paper. We all went and had dinner with Uncle John and aunt Ann. It has grown cooler tonight.

I got all the wood that is here worked up and piled.

Sunday, April 15

Quite cool but does not freeze as yet.

We all went to church this forenoon.

Will and Millie came up and took dinner with us as it was Easter. Don brought Nellie back tonight.

Monday, April 16

Quite cool this morning. Mounted up some paintings. Parked the negatives and shipped them south by express. Kate planted some lettuce and radish.

Tuesday, April 17

Very nice day. We had the garden plowed this forenoon. Don took Kate out to the Webster cemetery to the burial of an aunt. I packed and nailed up three boxes of freight to send south. Will came up tonight to a band practice.

Wednesday, April 18

Been a warm day.

I packed the pictures and my trunk today and got my things hauled to the depot.

Mr. Hicks came this afternoon and we put in a telephone.

News has come of a terrible earthquake in San Francisco this morning.

Thursday, April 19

Got at 4 o'clock this morning so as to get off on the early train. Said good bye to the folks and started south. I stopped all the forenoon in Detroit and visited the Saviguy Studios. Left afternoon for Cincinnati and there I got sleeper for Asheville. The news of the San Francisco earthquake grow worse and worse.

Friday, April 20

While we waited at Knoxville this morning I went to the Cumberland Hotel and called on Mr. and Mrs. Heelan. Went up town at Asheville for a short time and then came on to Brevard tonight.

Saturday, April 21

Did considerable trading this forenoon so as to have something to eat while I stay up in the Sapphire country.

Took dinner with Dr. and Mrs. Cheatham.

Settled with Mr. Nichols for the pictures he has sold for us the past winter.

Came on up to Lake Toxaway tonight.

I find there have been many changes in business ways up here.

Sunday, April 22

I made Mr. Jacobs folks a short visit this forenoon and had a good talk with Mr. Burrows about the picture business for this year. Had dinner with Mr. and Mrs. Nixon. Walked up to our mountain home this afternoon.

Mr. Burlingame hitched up and we went to Sapphire for my grip. I had supper with them. Am going to try sleeping in the house tonight.

Monday, April 23

Been at work trying to get things shaped so I can be comfortable in the home again. Made one trip to Sapphire. Ate some of the lunch put up at home for my dinner. Had breakfast at Dave Miller's and got my own supper.

Tuesday, April 24

The mercury was below freezing this morning and I fear much damage was done to fruit buds and blossoms.

Alfred Miller brought my trunk, express box of negatives, and freight from Philadelphia. I wanted the box of provision most of all but it did not come.

Wednesday, April 25

Did some at cleaning house this forenoon. Went to Sapphire about noon on summons from Mr. Burrows and so had dinner there. Sold some of our paintings to the guests. Had supper with the Burlingames this evening. It has turned real warm. Had a card from Kate written last Saturday.

Thursday, April 26

Been sawing wood most of the day, Mr. D. Miller helping me. Mr. Burlingame went to Lake Toxaway and got my box of provision and sack of Graham flour.

Had a letter from Kate and Dewey tonight.

Friday, April 27

Spent most of the forenoon at Sapphire and sold some more pictures.

Did a little tree triming this afternoon but several showers hindered all our work.

Saturday, April 28

Been a warm but pleasant day.

I sprayed the grape vines, cherry trees, pear trees, some of the plum and a large number of the peach trees. I am pretty tired tonight. Went over to Burlingames but found no mail.

It is very warm tonight and threatens rain.

Sunday, April 29

We had a thunder shower this forenoon.

I slept, read and rested the day out.

Dave Miller and wife came up and called on me this afternoon and we went about in the orchard.

I wrote to Kate and took the letter over to Burlingames tonight.

Monday, April 30

I finished spraying peach and plum trees this forenoon. Did a little pruning this afternoon then went to Sapphire to take pictures to the Sapphire Inn.

There was hard thunder but the rain did not come here.

I had a letter from Kate this afternoon.

Tuesday, May 1

I went to Lake Toxaway today to settle at the Inn.

Took dinner at the Jacobs and had a good visit.

There was quite a hard shower at noon time, making the walking some sticky as I came back home.

Wednesday, May 2

Very pleasant day but quite breezy.

I went up on Mt. Toxaway to take up a stock of pictures to place on sale at The Lodge.

I am as fond of making the trip up there as ever and enjoy the grand scenery. It thunders about tonight and acts like rain.

Thursday, May 3

It rained most of this forenoon.

I had Dave cut an old chestnut tree back of the house, then the rain ran us in.

It stopped storming at noon, and I pruned fruit trees this afternoon.

Went over to Burlingames and got my mail tonight. Had a letter from ma and Kate.

Friday, May 4

Worked hard on the place all day, most of the time triming apple trees.

It is cooler tonight.

Saturday, May 5

Been very pleasant day. I worked all day cleaning up and fixing things at the shop.

Dave set out a new strawberry bed for me this afternoon.

Mr. Burlingame and Lucy called a little while this evening. After supper the watered the new strawberry bed by moonlight.

Sunday, May 6

There was a good shower this morning.

Mr. Burlingame came over and we looked over the peach trees.

This afternoon I went over to Dr. Grimshawes and had a nice chat.

Was overtaken by a heavy thunder shower at Burgess' and made them a long call. It is cooler tonight and seems to be clearing up.

Monday, May 7

It was cool, gloomy and threatened storm all the forenoon but cleared off very bright this afternoon. I was over at Sapphire this forenoon. Fixed up the paths some this afternoon. Had letters from Kate and from Hiram tonight. It seems cold enough to frost.

Tuesday, May 8

There was frost this morning but I did not see that it hurt anything here. I went over Rainy Knob this morning to look at things there. I found all fruit trees seeming to be doing well. I spent most of the day pruning apple trees. Mr. and Mrs. Giles of Toronton, Canada, who are at Sapphire Inn, called this afternoon.

Wednesday, May 9

This is Dewey's birthday and I would like to have been home. Have felt near to being homesick today.

I did more pruning of apple trees. It has been very cool and windy, but is getting calm tonight so I fear heavy frost.

Thursday, May 10 Ther.: 29+

There came a bad freeze last night and lots of our fruit has been killed. It is very discouraging. I felt so sort of dazed I just puttered about all the forenoon. This afternoon I went over to Sapphire and sold some of our paintings to the guests at the Inn. Made up some kerosene emulsion this evening and sprayed a tree infested with scale.

Friday, May 11

I sprayed apple trees and grape vines this forenoon.

Did odd jobs this afternoon.

Called at Burlingames tonight.

It has turned warmer.

Saturday, May 12

Worked at the shop a good share of the day, unpacking negatives and fixing to do some developing tonight. I went over to the Sapphire Inn for a while after dinner to take over more pictures.

Dr. Gorman, a dentist from Asheville, came in on horseback and stopped a while to give an order for pictures.

Sunday, May 13

A nice day.

Some people from the Sapphire Inn came over this afternoon to look over our pictures.

I went over to Mr. Burlingames and spent the evening.

Monday, May 14

Quite warm in the sun today.

I went to Sapphire and up to Fairfield this afternoon. Made some film negatives which I developed tonight.

One of the hotel guests gave me some magazines which I brought home. Had a letter from Kate and one from Hiram.

Tuesday, May 15

Bright day.

I made platinum prints for the paintings.

Had word tonight that my freight in at the Lake.

Wednesday, May 16

Been warm, pleasant day.

Went down to Alfred Millers this morning to get a team to go for my freight.

Printed Platino paper most all day.

Poly Miller brought my freight in tonight and it looks all right.

Thursday, May 17

I unpacked the freight this forenoon and found everything all right. Am ready now to do business.

Did a little platinum finishing this afternoon but clouds and a very little sprinkle stopped my printing.

I had letters from Kate and Nellie tonight.

Friday, May 18

Bright and warm this forenoon, cloudy this afternoon.

I finished a batch of platino prints.

Saturday, May 19

I put in a day of printing and finishing photos.

It threatened heavily to rain this evening but all blew over and I fear is going to stay dry.

Sunday, May 20

Been a beautiful day. I read, wrote and fussed some with my finished photos.

Went to Burlingames and had supper tonight.

Monday, May 21

Cloudy and foggy all day with a little shower this evening. I walked down to Lake Toxaway this forenoon going by Sapphire. I went to Mr. Burrowes. Took dinner with Mr. and Mrs. Nixon.

Received some pictures from Kate and a letter tonight.

Tuesday, May 22

Went to Sapphire Inn this forenoon and from there up the The Lodge on Mt. Toxaway where I had dinner and then hunted purple Rhododendron. We had nice showers last night.

Some miserable cat tore done the pheb birds nest on the porch and ate up the young during last night.

Wednesday, May 23

Got up very early this morning and went over to Burlingames for breakfast. Then I went up to "Camp Sapphire," the Backus place, to try some views for him. Mounted some of the paintings this afternoon. Received a large package of paintings from Kate tonight.

Thursday, May 24

I worked at fixing up paintings about all day.

Some ladies came over from the hotel this forenoon and I showed them about the place.

Been pleasant but cool all day.

Friday, May 25

Been drizzling all day.

Worked at the paintings again.

Don't feel first rate tonight and am going to bed without any supper.

Saturday, May 26

It rained hard all last night and all this forenoon.

I went to Sapphire Inn this afternoon and found Mr. Hillars, the Washington photographer artist, there and had a good visit with him.

Have felt rather weak all day.

Sunday, May 27

Threatened storm all day, but did not rain till this evening when it showered. I am anxious to go to Whiteside Cove this week and fear continued storms will hinder me. I was at Burlingames for supper tonight.

Monday, May 28

Got up early so as to get a good start for Whiteside Cove. I was there and exposed a good many films before dinner. This afternoon I walked on to Highlands making a hard days work. It has been a fine day, but is windy and cool tonight.

Tuesday, May 29

Went to Sunset Rocks to make views this morning. Called on some friends and after noon I went out to Glen Falls.

It has been nice day.

Wednesday, May 30

Came back home today stopping at Grimshawes for dinner. Was pretty tired when I got here.

Took supper at Burlingames and they had a strawberry shortcake.

Thursday, May 31

Been a warm day.

I went to Sapphire and then up on the mountain to check up and see how many pictures had been sold.

I did some developing of films tonight.

Friday, June 1

I went to Lake Toxaway today to settle the two accounts.

It was a warm walk.

Took dinner with the Nixon's.

It is raining tonight.

Saturday, June 2

Worked in the shop about all day.

Sent my baggage down to Lake Toxaway by Mr. Miller this afternoon.

Went over to Burlingames this evening and stayed there to supper.

Sunday, June 3

Got up very early this morning and walked down to Lake Toxaway. Came on train to Brevard and Hiram was at the train to meet me. It rained quite heavy this afternoon so we did not get out to walk.

Monday, June 4

Stayed around Hiram's Gallery about all day. It rained very hard this evening. I had my walking shoes tapped, wrote to mother and Kate, and did various errands.

Tuesday, June 5

Wet day. Spent most of my time in reading and resting.

Wednesday, June 6

Very pleasant day.

I took a walk up the railroad this forenoon.

Hiram and I went to a little mountain called Elk Lodge to try getting some views this afternoon. It was a sightly place looking over the valley and to the mountains beyond.

Thursday, June 7

Left Brevard this forenoon and had dinner at Hendersonville. Saw Mr. Toaker at his gallery and he complimented our painted work very highly. Came on to Tryon tonight and Mr. Conner met me at the train.

Friday, June 8

Started out early this morning and went up through Howard Gap and on trails back of Tryon Mountain up to Skyuka and Log Cabin Inn where I had dinner. The weather was fine and I made a number of exposures with the Kodak.

Saturday, June 9

I did but little work today. Went over town this forenoon. There was quite a heavy thunder storm this afternoon.

Sunday, June 10

Spent the day in visiting. Had a little group work to do this afternoon as the Keenan family were at Mr. Howe's and will leave for Colorado on Tuesday.

Monday, June 11

I went up on Tryon Mt. today thinking there would be a fine cloud display, but was disappointed somewhat. I had a long walk. This is the second anniversary Kate and I have had to be apart. It was the 22nd.

Tuesday, June 12

This morning a Dr. Shaffer went with me and we took in Melrose Falls. It began raining at noon and had come down all the rest of the day. I had 4 letters from home and was glad to get them. Am staying at Mr. Howes tonight.

Wednesday, June 13

Things looked like a flood this morning and it has rained all day. I went over town this forenoon and settled with Missildine. I sent Kate \$20 and received my check from the Toxaway Hotel Co.

Thursday, June 14

No sunshine today so got no views. It did not rain so I hop for fair weather tomorrow. Tried taking some interiors for the drug store this afternoon. I loaded all my plate holders tonight.

Friday, June 15

It rained all this forenoon but cleared for a while this afternoon so I got over town and made some exposures.

Saturday, June 16

I went out beyond Lynn today noon to try a view but weather was against me. Had to take shelter from a rain for about an hour. I packed up and said good by to my Tryon friends and started for Brevard this evening but am hung up in Hendersonville for the night.

Sunday, June 17

Got to Brevard about noon today. Hiram and I took a nice walk out by the French Broad this afternoon. We met a hard shower just as we were getting back.

Monday, June 18

I came home today. The train was late so I did not leave the Lake till about 3 o'clock to walk up. Took supper with the Burlingames. It threatened heavy but did not rain here today.

Tuesday, June 19

I planted the fig sprouts Mr. Howes gave me. Picked some cherries and strawberries, so I have fruit to eat. I killed a copper head snake at the wood pile this forenoon.

Wednesday, June 20

This has been a clear day. I printed some platinum photos and finished them. Had a letter from Kate tonight.

Thursday, June 21

Been a very nice day. Dave Miller began mowing the grass and weeds on the place. I went over town this afternoon and took more pictures to the store. Carried a few berries to Mr. and Mrs. Armstrong. Am having red raspberries now.

Friday, June 22

Perfectly clear day. I worked in the shop all day.

Mrs. Burlingame gave me a pie tonight made from the cherries I gave her.

Saturday, June 23

Finished a mess of photos this forenoon. It is raining tonight and much cooler.

Sunday, June 24

It took most of the forenoon to do up my house chores and get cleaned up for Sunday. Mr. Burlingame called about noon. I wrote some letters and took them over to Lucy to mail. There was a very heavy wind tonight and some rain.

Monday, June 25

It was very warm until a thunder storm came just at night. I hoed out the strawberry bed this forenoon. Printed some photos and had some portrait sitters this afternoon.

Tuesday, June 26

This has been one of the most beautiful days I ever saw and I regret that I worked in the shop instead of being out with camera. I did make a few Kodak views toward night.

Wednesday, June 27

Warm and muggy. I made more platinum prints. There was a heavy shower this evening.

Thursday, June 28

Worked in the shop most all day. Dave finished the mowing and I paid him in full. Had a letter from Kate tonight. There was a little shower just after noon.

Friday, June 29

I went to Sapphire and Mountain Lodge today to count up pictures. Sales have been small this month. I had dinner at The Lodge. It has been warm.

Saturday, June 30

I went to Lake Toxaway today and settled with The Hotel Co. for sales during June. Had dinner with Mr. Nixon. Been getting ready to start for Whiteside tomorrow.

Sunday, July 1

Got up early this morning, packed up things, and Dave Miller brought me to the Grimshawes in Whiteside Cove. It has been a lovely day.

Monday, July 2

I went out this forenoon and made 3 exposures on the Whiteside Mountain. A rain set in this afternoon and put a stop to my work.

Tuesday, July 3

It rained all last night and the most of today some very hard showers. This afternoon I tried some portrait work on the lawn and some Kodak pictures of clouds on the mountain.

Wednesday, July 4

No firecrackers for me today. Today has been fair and beautiful. I went to Zeb Alley this forenoon and to James Alleys this afternoon. Made some group pictures here at the Grimshawes tonight.

Thursday, July 5

I was brought up to Highlands this forenoon and am stopping at Smiths as usual. I went up on Satulah Mt. this afternoon. Met a man up there who used to be in Michigan. Got a letter from Kate tonight.

Friday, July 6

It rained in torrents during last night and had been so dull and cloudy all day I could make no pictures. I called at "Faraway" this forenoon. Was at the Sherwood Library this afternoon and met the founder. Had a letter from Kate tonight. Don is coming south with her.

Saturday, July 7

Cloudy all day, but I made a few photo exposures. Had dinner at the Davis House and supper at Mr. Whites.

Sunday, July 8

More rain today. Dave Miller came for me and we drove home this afternoon and did not get very damp.

Monday, July 9

Nice, pleasant day. I mounted some paintings and did some printing on glossy paper. I had a letter from Kate this evening and as they are to start south tomorrow I will not get any more probably.

Tuesday, July 10

I suppose Kate, Don, and Dewey started for here today. It has been a fair day. I finished a batch of pictures this forenoon. Am intending to go to Brevard tomorrow to met the folks.

Wednesday, July 11

I rode down to the Lake with Mr. Miller this morning and this afternoon. I went to Brevard to be there to meet Kate, Dewey and Don as they came in on the train tonight. We are all staying at Mrs. Jacobs. Don and I called on Hiram and he took us to have ice cream.

Thursday, July 12

We came to Lake Toxaway at noon and there were teams to meet us, so we got home in good season this afternoon. We all had supper with the Burlingames.

Friday, July 13

I worked in the shop about all the day. Don and I walked over to Sapphire toward evening. There has been no mail come for several days the carrier having just quit.

Saturday, July 14

It has rained all day so we could not go out to gather any fruit. I spent the day in developing my Highlands exposures.

Sunday, July 15

Kate has been sick all day. Don is getting better. There have been showers, but I could get out and pick some berries. I called at Burlingames this evening and found Ed Raines there. He has just returned from Washington State.

Monday, July 16

Worked in the shop all the forenoon. Went up to Fairfield Inn this afternoon to put in a stock of paintings. It did not rain during the day but storms tonight.

Tuesday, July 17

It has been raining a good deal today. I worked in the shop all day.

Wednesday, July 18

Don and I went up on Rainy Knob before breakfast this morning to see cloud effects and it was very beautiful. Worked at the shop all day. Mr. Williams was over this afternoon and I tried some photos of him in his soldier clothes.

Thursday, July 19

I went to Lake Toxaway today taking Don down to see the Horse Pasture falls as I went. There was a heavy rain down there at noon, making it a muddy walk home.

Friday, July 20

More showers today but I did a little printing this morning. Dewey had a letter from his grandma this evening. I think Don is becoming somewhat disgusted with the place.

Saturday, July 21

This has been quite a fine day. There were some showers about but none here. Don and I went up to Fairfield this afternoon as I had to take up some more paintings.

Sunday, July 22

Quite a pleasant day. Mr. Burrows and Mr. Jacobs made us a short call toward evening.

Monday, July 23

I finished two batches of photos today, 181 pictures in all. Kate, Don and Dewey did the washing this forenoon. Thunder showers this afternoon and evening.

Tuesday, July 24

It was pleasant today till late this afternoon when there came a down pour. I made a batch of platinums for Kate to paint. Kate, Dewey and Don went to see the Thompson Falls this afternoon.

Wednesday, July 25

It has not rained today, but been very threatening all day. I sent Mr. Dave Miller after freight to Lake Toxaway but it hadn't come. Had a letter from mother tonight.

Thursday, July 26

The Sapphire Inn burned up last night. It seems like a serious loss and I doubt if it is rebuilt right away. I did more platinum printing and Kate painted.

Friday, July 27

Dewey and I went over to Sapphire this morning to see the ruins of the burned Inn. I heard tonight that the Inn would be rebuilt at once. It rained several sharp showers this afternoon.

Saturday, July 28

I went to Lake Toxaway this forenoon and took more of our paintings to the News Stand. Hiram came up on the train and we walked home this afternoon. It did not rain any during today, but a shower came tonight.

Sunday, July 29

Hiram, Don, Dave, Dewey and I all spent some time this afternoon on Rainy Knob mountain. We had some showers this afternoon. We all called on the Burlingames late this afternoon.

Monday, July 30

Hiram left for home this morning riding down to the Lake with Dave. I did a little platinum work this forenoon. At noon it began raining and we had heavy showers all the afternoon.

Tuesday, July 31

I went up to Fairfield this morning to make statement and start for a new month. Then Don and I went up on Mt. Toxaway and spent most of the afternoon. It rained a good deal and the view was not extra good.

Wednesday, August 1

I went to Lake Toxaway this afternoon, riding down with Dave. I had a settlement with the company for July work. I walked back and did not get caught in a storm though it rained about. Don cut wood for Mrs. Burlingame this afternoon.

Thursday, Aug. 2

It did not rain any today, but it poured tonight to make up for it. Don and I went to the Whitewater Falls and found them very beautiful.

Friday, Aug. 3

Cloudy and showery most of today. I worked in the shop all day. Received checks today from Hotel Co. and from Russell at Highlands, for pictures sold during July.

Saturday, Aug. 4

Don and I went to Sapphire this morning and came home by the Narrows. The water is high and scenery good. There was some showers during the day. I worked at mounting paintings.

Sunday, Aug. 5

This has been a beautiful day and no rain. I wrote some letters and did up some paintings to send away. Took a few peaches to some of our neighbors this afternoon. Don and I called at Burlingames tonight.

Monday, Aug. 6

It rained hard during last night. Alfred Miller took Don to the Lake today. He was going to Brevard to spend tonight and then go on tomorrow. Kate washed and canned peaches.

Tuesday, Aug. 7

Been a very fine day. I did platinum printing. Dave took some of our peaches to market.

Wednesday, Aug. 8

Another day without rain. Worked in the shop till supper time then we all went to the Holmes camp on the Thad Miller place and made them a call. We found about a house full and more to come.

Thursday, Aug. 9

Fine day and we begin to hop we will have some nice weather this summer after all. I worked in the shop all day.

Friday, Aug. 10

One little shower but a very good sort of day. I went up to Fairfield with pictures. Mounted more of the paintings this afternoon.

Saturday, Aug. 11

Been a pleasant day but very warm for this place. I went to Lake Toxaway to carry pictures to the Inn and send some to Hiram. It seems like the warmest night we have had.

Sunday, Aug. 12

Did nothing today but sleep and rest. Mr. Burlingame made us a call about noon. There were heavy thunder showers this afternoon.

Monday, Aug. 13

Went to Sapphire with mail this forenoon. Worked in the shop most of the day. It was quite pleasant till this afternoon late when it rained hard. Dave began hoeing through the orchard today.

Tuesday, Aug. 14

Warm, muggy weather with frequent showers. Worked in the shop all day.

Wednesday, Aug. 15

Went to Fairfield inn this forenoon to take up more pictures. Got back to Sapphire just as it began to rain.

Thursday, Aug. 16

Made Platinum prints this forenoon. Finished Postcards this afternoon. There was a very heavy thunderstorm this afternoon rain coming in torrents.

Friday, Aug. 17

Dewey and I went down to Arthur Miller's this morning and took them a pail of peaches. Then we went and called on the Holmes folks at Thad Millers old place. The rain did not come till late this afternoon. There was a big storm during last night and it looks like more tonight.

Saturday, Aug. 18

I walked over to Whiteside Cove this forenoon carrying pictures to be sold there. I found a nice lit[?] there for the sales that have been made. It raines this afternoon and I will have to stay all night.

Sunday, Aug. 19

I left the Cove early this morning and got home before 10 o'clock. I came by Chimney Top Gap. We had Mr. and Mrs. Burlingame at dinner with us. It threatened rain but only sprinkled a little.

Monday, Aug. 20

Went to Lake Toxaway today to do some special work for Mr. Burrowes. I rode down and back on the hacks from Fairfield. It was cloudy and misty a good deal all the day.

Tuesday, Aug. 21

Did platinum printing this forenoon. Wrote letters and fixed up paintings this afternoon.

Wednesday, Aug. 22

Did more printing this forenoon. There were showers this afternoon.

Thursday, Aug. 23

Went to Lake Toxaway early this mornig. Dave took my camera and I walked down. There was a boat regatta and races on the lake and I was there to photograph.

Dave and I got in the dark coming home tonight but we missed the rain.

Friday, Aug. 24

Worked in the shop mounting and fixing up a lot of paintings. Rev. Holmes and his nephew called on us about noon. We all went up on Rainy Knob this afternoon. Kate had not been on a mountain since they came down.

Saturday, Aug. 25

Had a headache about all day. We went to the Narrows this forenoon, then we went to Sapphire. Kate and Dewey came home and I took pictures up to Fairfield. Late this afternoon there was a heavy thunder storm and Dewey and I got drenched up in the orchard.

Sunday, Aug. 26

There has been heavy showers today. I picked a nice lot of peaches and plums in the upper orchard. Ethel Miller was here at dinner.

Monday, Aug. 27

Took a lot of mail over to Sapphire this forenoon. Dave finished hoeing trees. I made developing paper pictures this afternoon. There was a little rain and much threaten.

Tuesday, Aug. 28

Cloudy a good part of the day, but I printed a batch of platinum this afternoon. Had to go to Sapphire with mail again this forenoon. I picked peaches, plums and apples up on the hill tonight.

Wednesday, Aug. 29

More or less rain all day and tonight there is a heavy storm. Spent good part of forenoon trying to make a wind mill for Dewey. Mounted a large lot of paintings this afternoon.

Thursday, Aug. 30

Heavy rain during last night and several showers today. I went to Sapphire with mail this forenoon. Mr. Dave Miller and I put in the afternoon working on the road fixing up some washouts.

Friday, Aug. 31

It has not rained today, but there has been rumblings of distant thunder. I went to Sapphire, Fairfield and Mountain Lodge to make out my monthly statements for sale of my pictures. I got a water melon at Sapphire and after cooling it in the spring we ate it tonight.

Saturday, September 1

Another day without rain. I went to Lake Toxaway and had a settlement for the month. Kate and Dewey were at Arthur Millers as I came home.

Sunday, Sept. 2

No rain today. We took dinner at Burlingames today as this is the last Sunday Kate and Dewey will be here.

Monday, Sept. 3

Did printing of Platinum this forenoon and developing paper this afternoon. It has been a nice day but some cloudy.

Tuesday, Sept. 4

There was rain this afternoon and a hard one. I worked in the shop all day. Mabel and Bessie Burgess called on Kate. We have ripe peaches, pears and grapes now.

Wednesday, Sept. 5

Hard rain this forenoon. I went to Sapphire this forenoon to carry over my mail and I got pretty wet by the time I got wood and apples. Worked in the shop this afternoon.

Thursday, Sept. 6

Rain, clouds and mist today, with a little sunshine this forenoon. Worked in the shop about all day.

Friday, Sept. 7

I went to Fairfield this forenoon to take up some paintings and carry mail to Sapphire. Kate has been busy packing and getting ready to start away tomorrow. I called at the Holmes this afternoon. We had a heavy shower this evening.

Saturday, Sept. 8

Sunday, Sept. 9

Very nice day. It clouded up tonight and has sprinkled a little. Hiram and I took a long walk out by the French Broad and to Glen Canon Falls.

Monday, Sept. 10

I helped Hiram some today, and also made a few Platinum prints from some of his negatives. It has been a fine day. Did up my errands and made some calls this afternoon.

Tuesday, Sept. 11

Came up to Lake Toxaway on train this forenoon, but it set in to rain so I could do no photo work. I am staying at the Inn.

Wednesday, Sept. 12

I was at the view taking early this morning. Clouds and sprinkling came up through the middle of the day. Dave came for me and I am in the little home tonight, but it is very lonesome.

Thursday, Sept. 13

I have been sick all day. Probably the result of my stay in Brevard and Lake Toxaway. It has been a fine day and looks like fair weather.

Friday, Sept. 14

Feeling better today. Printed and finished Platinum Paper. Mr. Burrows, Mr. Jacobs, some Agr. Dept. men and others called on me about noon. Dave and I exploded some dynamite in "chuck" holes. I had supper and water melon with him and family. Had a card from Kate written on the cars the 11th.

Saturday, Sept. 15

It has been cloudy all day. I worked in the shop at developing most of the day. Mr. Holmes came over and made me a call this afternoon.

Sunday, Sept. 16

It grew quite cool last night. There came a little misty shower this afternoon that stopped me from going to hear Mr. Holmes preach. Took supper with the Burlingames tonight.

Monday, Sept. 17

Pleasant most of the day, but windy and tonight a mist in the air. I went to Fairfield this forenoon to settle up as the Inn has closed. Went down and called on the Holmes' this afternoon as they leave tomorrow. Had a card from Kate at Dexter.

Tuesday, Sept. 18

This is my 45th birthday. It rained all last night and all today. It must by the equinctial storm. I had to get up some wood to burn in the fireplace. Went out to do a little fixing on the road and got soaked. It pours tonight.

Wednesday, Sept. 19

Went to Sapphire with mail this forenoon and found the rains had raised the river higher than anytime this year. Had a letter from Kate and they seem all well. The sun shone a little today, but some showers came and it is raining tonight. Mrs. Burlingame gave me a pie tonight.

Thursday, Sept. 20

It rained hard during last night. Was quite pleasant this forenoon and I printed a lot of platinum work for Kate to paint. It showered quite hard along toward night.

Friday, Sept. 21

Quite a pleasant day. There was only one little shower. Printed platino type paper. Went to Sapphire this afternoon.

Saturday, Sept. 22

I walked to Lake Toxaway and back today. It looked stormy all day and I got caught in a shower on the way home. Called at Burlingames tonight. Had a short letter from Kate.

Sunday, Sept. 23

I intended to go to Whiteside Cove today but it rained too much to be out. I went over and had dinner with Burlingames. I have a very mean headache tonight.

Monday, Sept. 24

No rain today but much threatening. I printed and finished a good lot of Platinums.

Tuesday, Sept. 25

It rained hard last night and this forenoon. I mounted some paintings and fussed about but did not accomplish much.

Wednesday, Sept. 26

Rain and dense clouds all day. Worked in the shop some fixing up paintings.

Thursday, Sept. 27

More rain and clouds. Fixed up some pictures to send to Highlands and took them over to the mail this afternoon. Had a letter form Kate and it is still very dry up there.

Friday, Sept. 28

More or less rain all day and very heavy showers this evening. Did writing of letters and fixing up pictures to send off. Got most of my things ready to start on my trip tomorrow.

Saturday, Sept. 29

Rained so forcefully hard I could not go today. Dave and I went to Sapphire this afternoon but the mail did not go today. I took supper with Dave and folks tonight. It is warm and thunders considerable.

Sunday, Sept. 30

It rained a little this morning and then quit for the day and Dave took me to the train at Lake Toxaway and I came to Brevard and am with Hiram tonight. It seemed good to see the sun shine this afternoon.

Monday, October 1

Rain again this morning and not pleasant any of the day. I took early train and came to Asheville this forenoon. Have been at work in hall helping about getting convention pictures hung.

Tuesday, Oct. 2

It was raining good and heavy this morning. Entered the convention school this afternoon and had very good time. Was at the meeting this evening too.

Wednesday, Oct. 3

Rain this morning and forenoon. I settled up with Mr. Law and received a check to balance our account. I changed my boarding place today and am now at the old Kentucky Home. The session tonight was more or less fun.

Thursday, Oct. 4

Sunday, Oct. 7

Not a cloud to be seen today. I wrote to Kate this morning and after breakfast I walked out to Conners where I am staying tonight.

Monday, Oct. 8

Been walking about all day. Had dinner at Thompson's near Lynn. Was over town this afternoon and settled with Missildine. Sent the check to the bank at Dexter. It has been a fine day.

Tuesday, Oct. 9

I went away over north of the mountains to visit some water falls today. It was rough and rugged scenery and I am pretty tired tonight. Had a letter from Kate. There was a sprinkle of rain and a sudden change cooler tonight.

Wednesday, Oct. 10

Made exposures on views around Tryon this forenoon. This afternoon Mr. Stevenson and I went up on Round Top mountain, from which there is a fine view. The weather is almost cold today.

Thursday, Oct. 11

Was out viewing all day. It was down to the freezing point this morning and there was a heavy frost.

Friday, Oct. 12

Went out by Lynn to got photo views this forenoon. Called on the Marshall's. Finished up my viewing for this trip this afternoon. Had supper at the Howes this evening. Frost this morning.

Saturday, Oct. 13

Left Tryon at noon and came to Hendersonville. Saw Mr. Baker and settled with him. Came on to Brevard this evening and am stopping with Hiram. It was some warmer today but still cool.

Sunday, Oct. 14

Been a fine day. Hiram and I took a walk out by the Davidson river, and as we came back we went up to Elk Lodge. Hiram has gone to a wedding tonight.

Monday, Oct. 15

Did some errands about town this forenoon. Came to the Lake tonight and am stopping at Toxaway Inn.

Tuesday, Oct. 16

I had breakfast with Mr. Jacobs' folks this morning. Went down to Toxaway Falls and made two exposures. Dave came for me and tonight I am alone again in the little mountain home.

Wednesday, Oct. 17

Misty and cloudy all day so I could not print. I developed some of the plates I exposed on my Tryon trip. I went over to the post office for the mail this afternoon.

Thursday, Oct. 18

Rained hard about all day. I continued developing and finished up work on hand tonight.

Friday, Oct. 19

It cleared up this morning and I went at the printing and got off a good batch. I did them up to mail and took them over to Burlingames tonight. Had a letter from Kate. The wind is high and is taking off the leaves.

Saturday, Oct. 20

Did a large batch of platinum prints. There were more or less clouds in the sky and I fear foul weather will come again soon. I had a letter from Dewey.

Sunday, Oct. 21

Stayed close at home till afternoon when I went over to Dr. Grimshawes to get some medicine Kate wanted for Dewey and Nellie. I had supper at Burlingames and Mr. Smith of Highlands was there so he came over to stay all night with me.

Monday, Oct. 22

Worked at pictures all day. It was quite pleasant and bright. There is a mist in the air tonight. Mr. Smith is here tonight.

Tuesday, Oct. 23

I came to Highlands with Mr. Smith today. It has been very pleasant weather.

Wednesday, Oct. 24

Cloudy all day so I could hardly do anything with the camera, but I made a couple of exposures on the Botanical Library. Made some calls this afternoon and took supper at Mr. Rideouts.

Thursday, Oct. 25

A clear and windy day. It has grown real cool. I went up on Sunset Rocks this forenoon and on Bear Pen Ridge this afternoon. Had dinner at Mr. White's.

Friday, Oct. 26

Left Highlands this morning and came down to Whiteside Cove. I went to Zeb Alleys and tried taking an interior for Miss Smedley. Am staying at the Grimshawes. Been a very nice day.

Saturday, Oct. 27

Came home today. Called at Burlingames tonight and got bread and my mail. Dave has gone to meet Hiram at Lake Toxaway. There was frost this morning and it is cool tonight.

Sunday, Oct. 28

Cold and windy day. I had breakfast at Dave Millers. Hiram was there and came home with me. I had to go down near Whitewater at noon time, and then I came back by Dr. Grimshawes and made a group photo.

Monday, Oct. 29 Ther.: 24+

Frozen hard this morning. Hiram went hunting. Mr. and Mrs. Smith of Highlands are visiting at Burlingames and called here this forenoon. I mounted pictures and also made a trip to Sapphire this afternoon. Hiram is cooking squirrel tonight.

Tuesday, Oct. 30

Sorted all my apples this forenoon. There were more or less clouds all day. I did some printing at noon time. Hiram and I sawed up a little wood. We called at Burlingames tonight.

Wednesday, Oct. 31

Been a bright day. It is freezing tonight. Worked at the pictures all day. Had Dave Miller fix up the cellar for winter. Hiram was out hunting most all day.

Thursday, November 1

Fine day. I made 100 prints for paintings. Had Dave cutting up wood all day. I did some developing tonight. Hiram cooked more squirrel.

Friday, Nov. 2

Another fine day. I made over 100 prints for Kate to paint. Dave fixed fence and chopped wood for me. Hiram did more hunting.

Saturday, Nov. 3

I went to Lake Toxaway this forenoon to settle up with Mr. Burrows, and to make some children's photos as I came back. It has been warmer today. Hiram and I had supper with Dave Miller's folks tonight.

Sunday, Nov. 4

Hiram and I walked up around Lake Fairfield today. We saw a bunch of nice deer in the woods near the lake. We are invited to go to Burlingames for supper.

Monday, Nov. 5

Hiram left early this morning. It was cloudy in the morning but cleared up before noon. It is quite smoky all about. I printed platinum today.

Tuesday, Nov. 6

Very smoky all day. This was election day but I am out of the voting just now. Worked at the pictures as usual. Had a letter from Kate tonight. Mr. McColl is dead.

Wednesday, Nov. 7

Printed last of platinum paper I have. Not so smoky as yesterday. Got bunch of pictures from Kate tonight.

Thursday, Nov. 8

Cloudy most all day and looked like rain or snow. Dave and I burned a fire guard on the west of the place this forenoon. I went to Sapphire this afternoon to mail photos and get some crackers.

Friday, Nov. 9

Worked at fixing up paintings about all day. Dave planted out about 60 red raspberry plants and did other odd jobs I had for him. I got no letters tonight.

Saturday, Nov. 10

Nice warm day. I retouched some portrait negatives this morning. Did considerable printing. Called at Burlingames this evening and got my mail.

Sunday, Nov. 11

It has been a windy day and some rain of a thin nature has fallen. Tonight it has grown suddenly cold. I had dinner at Burlingames. Have written several letters tonight.

Monday, Nov. 12 Ther.: 24+

Been cold all day with some snow squalls. It seems to be hard for me to keep warm. Mounted some pictures, chopped some wood, and kept up fires. Had letters from mother and Dewey.

Tuesday, Nov. 13 Ther.: 18+, 24+

Winter cold for this region. I can do nothing at my photo work. Called at Arthur Millers this forenoon, and at Dr. Grimshawe's, Mr. Burgesses and the Nicholsons this afternoon.

Wednesday, Nov. 14

A change came in the weather today and this afternoon it has snowed hard. I never saw so much snow here in Nov. It keeps cold, too. It makes me slow in getting ready to go north. Dave worked here this forenoon and put paper around the trunks of young apple trees.

Thursday, Nov. 15

Snow about 5 inches deep this morning. It thawed a little and then turned colder again. I get on with my work very slow. It is hard getting wood in the snow.

Friday, Nov. 16

It grew milder today and the snow went down some. I worked at packing away things all day. Called at Burlingames tonight and got my mail. Had letters from Kate and Nellie.

Saturday, Nov. 17

Been very busy packing trunk, writing letters and copy for new list and packing pictures to send to agencies. Had dinner with Dave's folks and supper at Burlingames. It has rained about all day and storms pretty hard tonight.

Sunday, Nov. 18

Rain all last night and all today. I could not get down to the Lake as I planned. Had breakfast at Dave Miller's and dinner at Burlingames. I wrote a lot of letters today, so no great loss without some gain.

Monday, Nov. 19

Drizzled considerable today. Alfred Miller did not come for me as I expected, but is going to get my baggage loaded so as to start early tomorrow. I came down to McGuire for tonight so as to get ready for the train tomorrow.

Tuesday, Nov. 20

Alfred Miller got down with my baggage in time and I took the train from Lake Toxaway this forenoon saw Hiram a moment at Brevard. Had a long wait in Asheville but am on the Cincinnati sleeper tonight.

Wednesday, Nov. 21

We were late getting to Cincinnati this morning. I left at 1 o'clock this afternoon and got home after 11 o'clock tonight. Kate and mother were up waiting for me. It has grown cold this afternoon and tonight.

Thursday, Nov. 22

Been cloudy and cool all day. I got my trunk this forenoon all right. Been down town a couple of times.

Friday, Nov. 23

Fairly pleasant today. I did a number of errands about town and wrote some letters.

Saturday, Nov. 24

Been a fine day. I did errands about town. Nettie West went to Ann Arbor this forenoon. Will came up tonight to see me. Bert Kenny brought another load of wood and took supper with us.

Sunday, Nov. 25

More or less cloudy all day. I took a walk with Dewey this afternoon down the railroad to where the locomotives take water. We saw three fast trains take water there. Kate suffers with toothache tonight.

Monday, Nov. 26

Rained some this forenoon but cleared up this afternoon. We all went to a concert tonight and had a nice time. Lizzie Steptor is staying tonight with Nellie.

Tuesday, Nov. 27

Cloudy most of today. I begin to think we will be obliged to move soon. I did some retouching on portrait negatives I brought from the south.

Wednesday, Nov. 28

Snow squall this morning but melted right off. Quite pleasant this afternoon. I looked about again for a house but with no satisfaction. Mounted a few paintings.

Thursday, Nov. 29

Thanksgiving day. We had our dinner all by ourselves. It has been a beautiful day. We feel all broke up about having to move and not knowing where we can go.

Friday, Nov. 30

Cloudy and some misty all day. I worked at making some prints on developing paper. Attended lodge tonight. It was election of officers.

Saturday, December 1

Grown cooler today. Some of my cards came and I mounted up some paintings.

Sunday, Dec. 2

This has been a raw chilly day. Dewey and I walked out to the old farm. We attended church out there and had dinner and supper with Will's folks. Will brought up back to town in his carriage.

Monday, Dec. 3 Ther.: 16+ A few snow flakes today and a mixture of clouds and sunshine. I did a lot of picture mounting. It is quite sharply cold tonight. Kate had a bad spell with her eyes this forenoon.

Tuesday, Dec. 4 Ther.: 20+, 38+

Warmer today. I did up and sent off a good many packages of pictures. Trimed and mounted a lot of paintings tonight.

Wednesday, Dec. 5

A snow storm this morning covered the ground. It has turned to rain tonight. We went to the Cong. Church for dinner. Worked at the pictures all day.

Thursday, Dec. 6

So warm this morning it melted all the snow. It turned colder this afternoon. I marked and did up a lot of pictures and sent south.

Friday, Dec. 7 Ther.: 16+

Quite cold today. Been marking and mounting pictures all day except while we were down town to start on our Christmas shopping.

Continues cloudy and threatening to storm. Nellie is pretty sick with the grip. Dewey and I took a walk this afternoon. Kate and I attended church tonight.

Monday, Dec. 10

Very dry and slippery this morning. Been a dark and cloudy day. I learned that we will have to move by Jan.y. 1st. Kate called the doctor in the night to see Nellie her throat was so bad, but she seems to be doing well today.

Tuesday, Dec. 11

The sun shone the most of today, and I printed a batch of platinum photos. Kate and I went house hunting this afternoon, but are not satisfied as yet.

Wednesday, Dec. 12

Grew warmer today. Made another batch of prints today. Sent off a lot of pictures this afternoon.

Thursday, Dec. 13 Ther.: 43+

Been very cloudy and misty all day, and quite warm, too. I spent most of my time in fixing up and mailing pictures. Have decided to rent the John L. Smith house. Mrs. Lizzie Webster came on the cars and made us a call, then went on out to Webster.

Friday, Dec. 14

Another dark day. I went to Ann Arbor to do some trading. Had dinner at aunt Hannah Price's. The stores are trimed for the Christmas show. Mother has gone out to Webster for a day or two.

Saturday, Dec. 15

It has grown much cooler today. I mounted up a lot of pictures as my card mounts came yesterday. Dewey is quite sick with a cold.

Sunday, Dec. 16

This has been a pleasant day and the sun shone, but tonight it is clouding up. Dewey is almost down sick with his cough. Will brought ma back tonight.

Monday, Dec. 17

Rather cloudy and squally looking today. I printed up some pictures to keep business going. Aunt Ann Spoor fell down today and hurt her arm badly. Dewey was better today and Nellie went to school again.

Tuesday, Dec. 18 Ther.: 13+

Cold morning. Nice, bright day and I made a good batch of prints.

Walked out to the farm this afternoon to get some glass. Jennie McColl came on the train tonight and is staying tonight.

Wednesday, Dec. 19 Ther.: 16+

Another fine day. Millicent came for Jennie this forenoon. Have been doing little odd jobs all day.

Thursday, Dec. 20

A morning of fair promise soon turned to a dark and cloudy day, and this evening a snow storm is on. Picture printing did not amount to much. Did some more Christmas shopping this forenoon.

Friday, Dec. 21 Ther.: 30+, 32+

All out door white with snow this morning and it has been storming slightly all day. Don came and got Nellie to go out to Webster to the Christmas doings tonight. It is colder tonight.

Saturday, Dec. 22

Quite cold again. I printed and finished platinum paper. Don brought Nellie back this afternoon. I took Dewey to a "Moving Picture" show tonight, but it was no good.

Sunday, Dec. 23 Ther.: 7+, 4+

Cold, crisp weather now. I just loafed and did some reading today. Kate and I called at E. Cransons late this afternoon.

Monday, Dec. 24 Ther.: 2+, 18+

Very cold this morning. I finished a batch of pictures that I had printed before I left Sapphire. The rest of the folks went to the Christmas Tree doings at the Methodist church tonight. Don and his Elsie called tonight. A number of Christmas presents have come.

Tuesday, Dec. 25 Ther.: 13+

Christmas and a very fine day. Will and his folks went to Ova McColl's at Homer, Mich. and I have the horse and buggy here. We had many presents from friends and relatives. Don and his girl were here to dinner. Kate, Mother and Dewey drove out to Webster this afternoon.

Wednesday, Dec. 26 Ther.: 30+

We have been tearing up carpets and getting things as near as possible ready to move out of this house tomorrow. It has moderated greatly for which we are glad.

Thursday, Dec. 27

We moved today and it has been hard work for us all. Ma went out to the old home with Will to stay a few days.

Friday, Dec. 28

Been at work all day with our settling. It still continues mild weather. The telephone was connected up today.

Saturday, Dec. 29

Continued our work of settling. It looks stormy all the time. Mother came back this afternoon, and Will's folks came down on the train from Homer and had the buggy to go out home with. I went as a bearer to take the body of a dead mason to the train tonight.

Sunday, Dec. 30

Been raining about all day. I spent the day reading and sleeping.

Monday, Dec. 31

The last day of '06. I had a team haul the rest of the coal wood and potatoes as it has been a warm day. The snow was all gone this morning. I made an order for postcards for my Highlands and Whiteside trade.
