Monday, January 1

It was cloudy and misty today. Kate did her washing, but hung the clothes in the windway. I wrote a number of letters this forenoon.

Tuesday, Jan. 2

This has been a rainy day, and I spent a good share of it in reading.

Wednesday, Jan. 3

Some rain today. I opened more of our barrels of goods.

Thursday, Jan. 4

It was foggy this morning but cleared up quite finely. I went over to Tryon to see a plummer about our new house. Had dinner at Conner's. They are about all sick with grip. It was muddy walking. Is cooler.

Friday, Jan. 5

It was cold and frozen up this morning, but has been quite a bright day. Did some wood sawing. We unpacked more books and put them on the shelves and got more kitchen utensils from the barrels.

Saturday, Jan. 6

Frozen hard this morning. Kate and Dewey walked over to Howes' and Conner's this forenoon. I worked up considerable wood during the day. The Post Office here was changed to another building this afternoon. There was snowflakes in the air tonight.

Sunday, Jan. 7 Ther.: 17+

About two inches of snow on the ground and much hanging to trees and bushes this morning. The first snow of any account we have seen this winter. It has been a bright day and much snow melted. Pretty cold this morning.

Monday, Jan. 8

A drizzling, freezing rain all today. I made a bench and opened more boxes of goods. Kate did her washing.

Tuesday, Jan. 9

It turned colder during last night with a heavy freeze and today has been sunny and clear. I fixed up a window to do photo printing by.

Wednesday, Jan. 10

A bright day. I fixed up the dining room and made a few developing paper prints this afternoon. Kate went out calling on some of the town ladies. The snow and ice melts rather slowly.

Thursday, Jan. 11

More or less cloudy all day. It has grown much warmer and may bring rain. I did some more printing this afternoon.

Friday, Jan. 12

Quite pleasant today. I did more photo printing.

Saturday, Jan. 13

There was more snow all over the ground this morning. It has grown colder and is quite sharp tonight. Kate and I went to the office of the clerk of the court, and made out a discharge of mortgage on the place Mr. Brown bought of here.

Sunday, Jan. 14

A cold, gray day. The editor came and had dinner with us and spent the afternoon.

Monday, Jan. 15

Winter still. I walked over to Tryon this afternoon and came home by way of Howes and Conners. It grew very cold and windy and was hard walking. It is a wild sort of night.

Tuesday, Jan. 16 Ther.: 10+

This is mother's birthday and she is 71. This morning was coldest of this year so far. We did little but get wood and build fires. The editor came in and had supper with us tonight.

Wednesday, Jan. 17 Ther.: 20+

Moderating this morning. Printed platinum paper today.

Thursday, Jan. 18

Much warmer. Finished the batch of platinum prints made yesterday.

Friday, Jan. 19

Nice pleasant day. Printed platinum paper. Cooler tonight.

Saturday, Jan. 20

Continues pleasant. Dewey walked over to Tryon and the Howes and Conner's. He was tired walking through mud coming home. I worked at pictures.

Sunday, Jan. 21

A very pleasant day. Spent the time writing and reading, but we took a short walk out in the woods.

Monday, Jan. 22

Kate did a large washing this forenoon and I chopped down two good sized pine trees in the road in front of the house, so as to let in more light.

Tuesday, Jan. 23

Got up early, started at daybreak, walked over to Tryon and took the train up to Hendersonville. Had dinner at Baker's and walked out to Dana through much mud this afternoon. Think matters about the house building are doing well as possible.

Wednesday, Jan. 24

The ground was some frozen this morning so it was not very bade walking into Hendersonville. I reached home this afternoon.

Thursday, Jan. 25

Printed platinum paper today. Kate received her money from Mr. Brown of Amherst in payment for the mortgage she held. Nice, pleasant day.

Friday, Jan. 26

Keeps warm and pleasant with mercury about 60 during day. I finished batch of platinum prints this forenoon, and made some developing paper prints this afternoon. Darlcies came and cleaned out the well today noon.

Saturday, Jan. 27

Warm pleasant day. Kate and I took a tramp up the mountain and gathered some Galax leaves. The climb about used Kate up.

Sunday, Jan. 28

Been cooler and cloudy all day. Tonight a cold rain has set in. Dewey and I took a walk out south and east of town this afternoon.

Monday, Jan. 29

This morning the trees and bushes were covered with ice, and stayed so about all day. More ice on things than I have seen for years. I did a little mounting of paintings.

Tuesday, Jan. 30

Ice all gone this morning and a nice pleasant day. I worked at mounting and marking pictures. Mr. Hughes is not well and we try to help them a little.

Wednesday, Jan. 31

Much cooler today. I worked at mounting, marking and signing pictures.

Thursday, February 1

Ther.: 24+

Went to Tryon today to take a stock of our pictures to the Dana store. Had dinner at Conners, and they gave me a thermometer.

Friday, Feb. 2 Ther.: 22+

Cool but pleasant and I did a printing of platinum paper. Had a letter and Bank Draft from Will, and Kate and I went down to the Court House and made an acknowledgement of discharge of mortgage on the old home place.

Saturday, Feb. 3 Ther.: 18+, 36+

I finished platinum prints this forenoon. Dewey went over to Howes and Conners for the day. Looked stormy this forenoon but was pleasant this afternoon. A little squall and sprinkle tonight.

Sunday, Feb. 4 Ther.: 16+, 20+

Cold day and rather windy. Only excitement today was the burning out of the chimney on the Hughes house and Mrs. Hughes rushing over to our house.

Monday, Feb. 5 Ther.: 14+

Kate washed and used her new wringer. I cut up some wood, as I plan to go to Dana tomorrow. It stays cold.

Tuesday, Feb. 6

Got up early this morning and walked to Tryon, took train to Hendersonville where I called at Baker's Art Gallery and then walked out to Dana. Tonight I had supper with Mr. Marshall, the head carpenter on our house. Then we looked over the plans and decided on the doors and windows.

Wednesday, Feb. 7

Today I walked all the way home from Dana, coming over the mountains through the Deep Gap and around by Mill Springs. I blistered both heels pretty badly.

Thursday, Feb. 8 Ther.: 28+

Another nice day. I wrote a number of letters this forenoon. Have rested up from yesterday's trip.

Friday, Feb. 9

I worked at Postcard printing all day. The weather is quite mild.

Saturday, Feb. 10

Finished another large batch of Postcards today. Tonight we all attended a play given by the scholars of the High School. It is snowing quite hard tonight.

Sunday, Feb. 11 Ther.: 26+

Ground all white with snow this morning, but it mostly melted during the day. Read, wrote and rested.

Monday, Feb. 12 Ther.: 22+

Been a nice day. Helped Kate some with the washing, and made out an order for grape vines and currant bushes, raspberries and blackberry roots.

Tuesday, Feb. 13 Ther.: 28+ Made a large batch of postcards today.

Wednesday, Feb. 14 Ther.: 32+, 32+

It began snowing early this morning and has snowed about all day, about 2 in. of damp snow. I did some writing and opened up the rest of my negatives and sorted them.

Thursday, Feb. 15 Ther.: 36+, 48+

Thawing, cloudy and misty all day. Much of the snow melted and we caught considerable water. I did a printing and finishing of postcards.

Friday, Feb. 16 Ther.: 36+, 50+

Fairly pleasant day. There is still snow on Tryon Mountain. There was lots of snow up in the mountains the last storm.

Saturday, Feb. 17 Ther.: 40+, 46+, 44+

A dull, cloudy day. We put in full time at picture work. A letter from Dana announces that water was struck in the well on our place.

Sunday, Feb. 18 Ther.: 42+, 50+

Rain last night and this morning, so we caught some rain water. It cleared off and was quite a pleasant day. We took a walk up on the little mountain this afternoon.

Monday, Feb. 19 Ther.: 36+, 60+, 50+

Quite warm and spring like weather. I walked to Tryon this afternoon, and came back by Howes and Conners for a call. Peepers are piping away in the wet places.

Tuesday, Feb. 20 Ther.: 40+, 60+, 54+

Some clouds and some sun, with a little sprinkle tonight. Made a batch of postcards.

Wednesday, Feb. 21 Ther.: 44+, 58+

A heavy rain last night and today, with an downpour of hail. There was a little thunder and tonight it is cooler. Mrs. Hughes is sick and Kate had to be over there this evening.

Thursday, Feb. 22 Ther.: 30+

Some frozen this morning. Dewey and I observed holiday by taking a trip up on Tryon Mt. From Sunset Rocks we could see snow capped mountains to the north. I made several exposures with the camera.

Friday, Feb. 23 Ther.: 20+

Real cold this morning. I made a large platinum printing today. It grew considerable warmer during the day.

Saturday, Feb. 24 Ther.: 33+, 36+, 38+

Rained most all day. I finished platinum prints.

Sunday, Feb. 25 Ther.: 36+, 50+

Been drizzling rain more or less all day. Read and wrote and ate popcorn. Miss Landis and Miss Edwards, teachers, called on us this evening.

Monday, Feb. 26 Ther.: 42+, 58+

Rain all last night and most of today. Late this afternoon it cleared up brilliantly and warmer. I made a few postcards and other prints. Received a new crosscut saw.

Tuesday, Feb. 27 Ther.: 34+, 36+

Cool, clear and breezy today. I did a large printing of platinum paper and finished it all up. Had a letter from Will, and the appraisers have called the old home worth \$9000.

Wednesday, Feb. 28 Ther.: 30+

Some frozen this morning. It was clear all day, but clouded some this evening. Printed and finished platinum photos.

Thursday, Feb. 29 Ther.: 42+, 58+

Another nice day. I mounted and fixed up some pictures. Received some new postcards to work on. Kate cut my hair this afternoon.

Friday, March 1 Ther.: 28+, 42+, 36+

Cool weather again. I made a large batch of postcards today.

Saturday, March 2 Ther.: 24+, 36+

Quite cold this morning. Dewey went to Tryon to spend the day. This afternoon Kate and I took a walk out in a part of the town we had not seen.

Sunday, March 3 Ther.: 32+, 34+

A mild snow storm all day, making it look wintry once more. Spent the day in reading and writing.

Monday, March 4 Ther.: 30+, 42+

Snow about all melted off today. It has been cloudy and chilly. Dewey and I did some sawing with our crosscut saw.

Tuesday, March 5 Ther.: 32+, 32+

Cloudy and damp all day. It rained this afternoon then came snow to make the ground whit and stick to the trees. I worked at Postcards.

Wednesday, March 6 Ther.: 28+, 42+

Cold and wintry looking this morning. A good share of the snow melted during the day. I worked at mounting pictures.

Thursday, March 7 Ther.: 36+, 52+

Much warmer and a little sunshine during the day. I tried to get a negative of the snow crowned Tryon Mountain. Made some developing paper prints this afternoon. The mud is very deep again.

Friday, March 8 Ther.: 40+

Mild and cloudy weather. Signed and marked some pictures. Had a telephone message from Mr. Case saying they were stalled on the house, and so I have to go up there tomorrow.

Saturday, March 9

Left for Dana early this morning. Weather mild there, but grew windy and turned colder. Had dinner at Baker's and then walked over to Dana. Saw the carpenters and fixed up all troubles. House is beginning to show up well.

Sunday, March 10 Ther.: 24+ at Columbus

Real cold this morning. Mr. Case went down to the new house with me and we looked over the place some. Went to Hendersonville this afternoon and am at Baker's tonight.

Monday, March 11

Came home today, having dinner at Howes' and calling at Conner's. The walking is better but not very good. Found the folks well.

Tuesday, March 12 Ther.: 36+, 44+

Considerable rain today, and growing warmer this afternoon. Spent most of the time cutting card board for mounts.

Wednesday, March 13 Ther.: 48+, 40+

Quite pleasant today. Worked at postcards making all day.

Thursday, March 14

Ther.: 32+

Fine forenoon, but clouded up this afternoon, and tonight it is raining hard. We all intended to go to Dana tomorrow, and it looks bad for the trip now.

Friday, March 15

The rain last night was very heavy and the streams are torrents today. It stopped raining at 9 o'clock and I got Mr. Mills to take us to Tryon and then it set and rained on us about all the way. A livery team took us from Hendersonville to Dana, and all the roads are fearfully muddy. We visited the new house and farm.

Saturday, March 16

This has been a fine day. Dewey and I put our the grape cuttings and planted sweet pea seed. The hardware man and the plummer came out today and we have ordered the Bath Room outfit and the kitchen range. It has been a busy day for us.

Sunday, March 17

Another fine day. Horace Case brought us to Hendersonville, and we are having a fine visit at Baker's. Their graphophone makes fine music.

Monday, March 18

Ther.: 60+

We had Dewey at the dentist's this forenoon to have his teeth fixed up. We came to Tryon this noon and then walked out home this afternoon. It looks rainy again.

Tuesday, March 19 Ther.: 48+, 76+, 64+

This has been a warm day and will start the buds soon. I printed a lot of platinum paper today.

Wednesday, March 20 Ther.: 44+, 80+, 70+

A real warm day. I finished platinum prints this forenoon and made postcards this afternoon. Received a letter from Mr. Dyer and check to pay for hay.

Thursday, March 21 Ther.: 54+, 80+

Another warm day. Printed and finished a large batch of platinum. A letter from mother says they had a heavy snow storm last week.

Friday, March 22 Ther.: 62+, 58+, 48+

A very cloudy day, growing cooler. I cut up a lot of platinum paper, but could do very little printing.

Saturday, March 23 Ther.: 44+, 38+

Rain and dark all day. I did but little at pictures.

Sunday, March 24 Ther.: 38+, 48+

Very cloudy until this afternoon when it cleared up nicely. Kate and I called on the Hills this afternoon. "Uncle Walter" as he is called is quite sick. Kate and Dewey went to church tonight.

Monday, March 25

Ther.: 36+

A beautiful and clear day, and I made up the platinum prints.

Tuesday, March 26

Left home early this morning and came to Dana. This afternoon I got a new mattock and shovel and made some places for planting grape vines.

Wednesday, March 27

Had garden spot plowed and barrowed this forenoon. Planted some potatoes, peas and lettuce this afternoon and set out 7 currant bushes. It has been a fine day, but looks some stormy tonight.

Thursday, March 28

I managed to get the raspberry plants out today by working between showers. Tonight there is a heavy rainstorm on from the east, and it will spoil my plans.

Friday, March 29

A regular flood during last night and ground so wet I cannot set out trees so unpacked all and huled them in. I went to a neighbors and got enough strawberry plants to set a small bed.

Saturday, March 30

I came back to Columbus today. It is some cooler weather, but very pleasant. Tonight we went to school house and listened to the speaking contest of the girls and boys.

Sunday, March 31

Ther.: 46+

A very nice day. We all went to the Baptist church and heard a good sermon to the students. We had dinner at the Hughes. Mr. and Mrs. Mills called on us this afternoon.

Monday, April 1

Kate's birthday. It rained some during the day, one quite hard shower. Kate went down to the Professors and milked the cow we are going to buy tonight.

Tuesday, April 2 Ther.: 60+, 72+

Kate was sick about all of today, and that with some showers prevented my going to Dana. Kate is better tonight and has gone to the school entertainment with Dewey. It seemed like pleasant weather this evening.

Wednesday, April 3

Quite cool today. I came up to Dana and have been setting out grape vines this afternoon.

Thursday, April 4

Finished planting out the grape vines and set a few cherry trees. Started using dynamite for making holes to set trees, and find it good way.

Friday, April 5

Been hard at work planting trees all day. It looked stormy this morning but cleared up and was bright later.

Saturday, April 6

I put in a long, hard days work, and finished planting the fruit trees. It looked so stormy I decided to start for home, and walked into Hendersonville this evening where I am staying with Mr. Baker.

Sunday, April 7

There was just a little rainfall during last night, but it did not storm any today. I got home at noon. Kate and Dewey are both suffering from colds, and are busy caring for the new cow.

Monday, April 8 Ther.: 50+

I spent today looking for some views for photos, but did not succeed much. Had dinner with the Conner's. It was cool this morning and has been a clear day.

Tuesday, April 9 Ther.: 34+, 69+

I saw a little frost on boards this morning. Made some prints and postcards this afternoon. Kate had a time with her cow kicking this morning but she was all right tonight. A fine day.

Wednesday, April 10 Ther.: 56+

Much warmer today. Trimed and mounted a lot of pictures. It was very cloudy this forenoon, but cleared off this afternoon.

Thursday, April 11

I took camera and made a trip up the Pacolet Valley today, making a number of exposures. It has been a fine, warm day. The dogwood is in bloom and many other flowers.

Friday, April 12 Ther.: 58+

Dewey went over to see the folks in the Pacolet Valley. He was late getting home by a strange road near the big mountain. I made some postcards this afternoon.

Saturday, April 13 Ther.: 60+, 79+

Looked rainy about all day but has cleared off tonight. Dewey and I fixed a yard for the cow this afternoon. Kate sold butter today, and has bargained milk for court week.

Sunday, April 14

Ther.: 60+

A pleasant day. Mr. and Mrs. Howes came over and made us a short call this afternoon. We went out in the woods and got some wild flowers.

Monday, April 15

Cloudy all day and tonight we are having a thunder shower. The rain will be nice for our new set trees. I walked over to Tryon and back this afternoon.

Tuesday, April 16 Ther.: 58+, 62+

It rained about all last night, and some this forenoon, so the ground is soaked up well. I made a lot of Postcards and fear they are all spoiled by yellow water.

Wednesday, April 17

Heavy rain again last night. I mounted some pictures and took a couple of dogwood blossom photos.

Thursday, April 18

A sunny and very pleasant day. Dewey and I took a long tramp going to the summit of Tryon peak, where we ate our lunch. I tried potos at some of the water falls.

Friday, April 19 Ther.: 46+

Quite cool this morning. Worked at the pictures and postcards all day. Mr. and Mrs. Howes and their boarders called here this afternoon to look at pictures.

Saturday, April 20

Ther.: 48+

It has been cloudy and rainy all day. I mounted pictures this forenoon. Went out this afternoon and made a couple of exposures for postcard work.

Sunday, April 21

Some drizzly this forenoon and cloudy all day. We had several callers this afternoon.

Monday, April 22

There was heavy rains last night and this morning. I made a batch of postcards. Court opened here today, and Dewey went to listen.

Tuesday, April 23

This has been a fine day. I made some prints of Toxaway scenery.

Wednesday, April 24

Came to Dana today. Took dinner at the Grimshawes in Flat Rock, walking out from Hendersonville with Mr. Grimshawe. They took me part way to Dana. Our house has been at a stand still for a week.

Thursday, April 25

I planted some more garden this forenoon and looked over the young trees and fruit plants which I find growing well. This afternoon Mr. Marshall took me up on King mountain and the view is beautiful.

Friday, April 26

I hoed the early potatoes and worked in the orchard getting out worms nests and brush, and sowing fertilizer among the trees. Made a few Kodak views showing some of our dogwoods in bloom.

Saturday, April 27

There came a heavy rain storm this forenoon, stopping all work and my plans to walk to Hendersonville. This afternoon I rode to Hendersonville with Mr. Case's team, and came on to Columbus tonight, having a muddy walk from Lynn.

Sunday, April 28

A very pleasant day. I did a lot of letter writing. Kate and Dewey went to church this forenoon, and Kate and I tonight.

Monday, April 29

Heavy rain during last night and many showers today. We began to pack up our things preparing to move.

Tuesday, April 30

We have been hard at work all day packing goods.

Wednesday, May 1

We arose at 3 o'clock this morning and at 6 I left with the cow and Kate and Dewey came on with Mr. Mills and the load of goods. We are all at our new home in Dana tonight.

Thursday, May 2

A nice day. We have just fussed about all day. I went to a neighbors and saw a demonstration of spraying.

Friday, May 3

We have been hard at work all day at many different things. The mason made the fireplace today.

Saturday, May 4

It has been rainy some of the day and cloudy all day. We expected Hiram and Leora Glover, but they failed to come.

Sunday, May 5

Misty and cloudy most of the day. We did some resting today. I called on Mr. Marshall this evening. We looked for Hiram and Leora today, but they did not come.

Monday, May 6

Heavy rain last night. The mason finished the fireplace and chimney today. I had to keep puttering about all day.

Tuesday, May 7

A very heavy rain last night with thunder and lightning. Hiram and Leora came tonight and we are having a good visit.

Wednesday, May 8

More rain last night, but a wind came up and it has been a clear day. Hiram and I tramped about on the place this forenoon, and this afternoon we all went up on King Mountain.

Thursday, May 9

Dewey's 14th birthday and I gave him a rifle with which I think he is pleased. We all took a walk to the east end of the place this forenoon. This afternoon Hiram and I took a walk up the Ridge Road and over the place I first wanted to buy and which is now for sale again. Mr. Mills came with another load of goods tonight. It has been a fine day.

Friday, May 10

Got up very early this morning, said goodbye to Hiram and Leora who leave this forenoon, and then I came on to Columbus with Mr. Mills, so I can finish packing our things here.

Saturday, May 11

Been busy all day packing up. It rained last night and there has been heavy thunder showers today, and they still come tonight.

Sunday, May 12

A beautiful day. I nailed up the last box, swept some of the floors and walked over to Mr. Howes in time for dinner. Had a feast of strawberries.

Monday, May 13

I came up to Hendersonville this forenoon, did some errands there and walked out home this afternoon and found Kate and Dewey all right.

Tuesday, May 14

Dewey and I went to Hendersonville this forenoon and visited the Dairy Car of the Sou. Ry. I had a lot of errands to do and then we walked home a new way.

Wednesday, May 15

We worked in the garden considerable today, and planted out main lot of potatoes. There was a sprinkle of rain, and it has looked stormy all day. The plastering went on again this afternoon.

Thursday, May 16

Heavy rains during last night, but very pleasant today. Have done some grubbing, picked up boards and other odd jobs. It has grown so cold tonight that we are some uneasy for fear of frost. We made a fire in the new fireplace tonight.

Friday, May 17

There was no frost this morning, but it was very cool. The tax assessors came today to list our property. We began cleaning out the up stair rooms this afternoon as the plastering there is done.

Saturday, May 18

A very busy day with us, cleaning up after plasterers, tearing down the scaffolds about the house, doing gardening and hoeing young apple trees. It has grown much warmer.

Sunday, May 19

Real cool this morning and we had a fire in the fireplace all the forenoon. Bright all day and warm in the sun. Read some, wrote a little and poked about on the place.

Monday, May 20

Quite warm today. This afternoon I went to Hendersonville to do a few errands. Rode over with team hauling lumber and walked back.

Tuesday, May 21

Nice warm day. Dewey is building a Brooder House to house the new Hover that came yesterday. Kate and I did considerable gardening. Most all the windows are hung in the house.

Wednesday, May 22

Walked through to Tryon today, bringing camera to make views, but the weather is not very good for my work being hazy.

Thursday, May 23

Was out trying for views all day. It has been a summer day and pretty hot.

Friday, May 24

I came home today from Tryon by way of Hendersonville, walking out. We set out Tomato plants this evening. The ground is getting dry.

Saturday, May 25

There was a heavy shower just after noon that moistened up the ground nicely. I went over to Mr. Marshall's to try and get a photo of a rose bush.

Sunday, May 26

We all stayed close at home today. I wrote some letters and had a short nap.

Monday, May 27

We got a telegram that the Day-old-chicks were shipped this morning, so they ought to get here tomorrow. I hoed about all the young fruit trees and grape vines. It showers some this evening.

Tuesday, May 28

A busy day. Dewey went to Hendersonville expecting the chicks, but they did not come. I worked some among the apple trees. We got 100 strawberry plants by mail and set them out this evening.

Wednesday, May 29

We had rain last night and this forenoon. The little chicks came today and I got a livery buggy to bring them out. This afternoon I walked to Sugar Loaf Mt. to try for some pictures of the scenery there.

Thursday, May 30

Spent the day in rambling over and about the cliffs of Sugar Loaf. The wild rhododendron and laurel are fine and I found many beautiful spots to try for pictures. Am stopping at Beulah House.

Friday, May 31

Came home this forenoon and found Kate in despair with her chicks about all sick. Work on the house is going on well. Mr. Mills brought the last load of our goods yesterday.

Saturday, June 1

A very pleasant day. I took Kodak and went to Hendersonville, where I spent most of the day at Laurel park and Lake Oseola. Got back home just at dark.

Sunday, June 2

Quite warm all today. We all stayed close at home for the day. I wrote some letters and took a nap.

Monday, June 3

Fixed a lunch for bench for Kate so she could use her tubs and wringer today. Did some developing of films tonight. We are having showers.

Tuesday, June 4

The carpenters finished work for the present, and took their tools up to the new Canning Factory. There came a hard shower this afternoon.

Wednesday, June 5

A warm day. I clean off the front porch and packed the lumber away this forenoon. Unpacked the new cook stove this afternoon.

Thursday, June 6

Sunday, June 9

Called on the Morrows at our old home this forenoon. They are going to have some fruit of most all kinds. Visited with Mr. Burlingame about all day.

Monday, June 10

Real cool weather. I went to Fairfield this forenoon and had lunch at noon with Mr. B. at the storm. Did some more calling this afternoon.

Tuesday, June 11

Mr. Burlingame brought me to Highlands today and it was a pleasant ride. I am at the Staub Cottage.

Wednesday, June 12

I went below Satulah Mt. to get some views this forenoon. There was said to be frost about here last night. Was out in the Park this afternoon.

Thursday, June 13

I went to Whiteside mountain today and tried to get some new views. Came back by Shoot Off. It looks stormy tonight.

Friday, June 14

Heavy rain last night and I did not start for Franklin today. Made some views about town and called on friends.

Saturday, June 15

Hard rain this morning, so I could not travel. Went up on Satulah, and spent good share of the afternoon visiting Prof. Harbison.

Sunday, June 16

This has been a nice day. I walked to Dillard, Ga., and got the train there for Franklin, N.C. and am with Mr. and Mrs. Geo. Jacobs tonight.

Monday, June 17

A beautiful but very warm day. I have been going about making exposures on films for our picture work. Took dinner with Mr. Smith, the druggist. Had a letter from Kate.

Tuesday, June 18

Been going about all and getting some views. It has been a hot day. Am through with my work for this trip to Franklin.

Wednesday, June 19

Walked back to Highlands today and got a few more views on the way. It was warm in the forenoon but grew very cool this evening. Had letters from Kate and mother.

Thursday, June 20

Ther.: 52+

I took a little trip out to Shortoff this forenoon. Called at the Sanitorium this afternoon. It is cool weather.

Friday, June 21

Left Highlands this morning and walked through to Sapphire and am at Burlingames. I called at Dr. Grimshawes and Squire Nicholsons. Had an awful heavy load to lug. It is raining tonight.

Saturday, June 22

Went over to Sapphire and around by Mrs. Crisp's this forenoon. There was a heavy shower just after noon.

Sunday, June 23

Mr. Burlingame was home today and we had a good visit. There was rain again this afternoon.

Monday, June 24

I walked to Lake Toxaway this forenoon and came to Brevard this afternoon. It has threatened rain all day.

Tuesday, June 25

Did a number of errands in town this forenoon. Called on Dr. Cheatham and wife this afternoon and then came to Hendersonville this evening and am at Bakers. It rains tonight.

Wednesday, June 26

Came home this forenoon from Hendersonville and found Kate and Dewey all right. We called at Marshalls this afternoon.

Thursday, June 27

Went to Mr. Jonathan Case this forenoon and settled up account to date. Kate and I worked in the garden some this afternoon. It rained again.

Friday, June 28

It threatened, but did not rain much today. Developing of the films I exposed on my trip is progressing well and I think we will have some fine pictures. Kate and I walked to the far end of our place this afternoon.

Saturday, June 29

Dewey and I have been doing carpenter work about all day. It has been pretty warm out in the sunshine. Had the last freight from Columbus come in tonight.

Sunday, June 30

I have been so sleepy today that I read but little. There are many clouds but no rain.

Monday, July 1

Kate did a big washing this forenoon and Dewey and I worked in the garden. We had a light shower this afternoon.

Tuesday, July 2

There was a heavy washing rain during last night. Did some letter writing this forenoon. Mr. Case showed me through the new canning factory this evening.

Wednesday, July 3 Ther.: 68+, 80+ There was a shower this morning, but the balance of the day was fine. I did up some pictures and sent off by mail.

Thursday, July 4 Ther.: 67+

Hobert Case, Dewey and I celebrated by a walking trip to Oleeta falls and the summit of a mountain there. We got home just before a very heavy rain broke that about flooded things.

Friday, July 5 Ther.: 68+

It rained hard a good share of today. I worked at mounting pictures.

Saturday, July 6 Ther.: 68+

Not much rain today but a shower or two. Worked at mounting pictures. Called at Mr. Edwards this evening to get some shoes he had mended for us.

Sunday, July 7

A very pleasant day. Kate and I went to church this forenoon. We had a couple of ladies and some children as callers this afternoon.

Monday, July 8

It showered during last night, but has been a pleasant day. I worked at the pictures all day. Called at Mr. Garrett's this evening.

Tuesday, July 9

Was sick last night, so did not accomplish much today. We had a heavy shower at noon.

Wednesday, July 10

I worked in the orchard a good deal today mowing and digging about trees. The leaf blight is bad and I fear will hurt the apple crop. More rain this afternoon.

Thursday, July 11

Printed and finished a batch of Platinum Paper today. Did some more work in the orchard toward evening. There was some rain and one very heavy clap of thunder this afternoon.

Friday, July 12 Ther.: 80+

Did some weed mowing this forenoon. This afternoon I pulled a lot of water out of the well, and hope to get it cleaned tomorrow. A plumber came from Hendersonville this afternoon to start work.

Saturday, July 13

A man came and cleaned the well this forenoon, and then I went down and finished the job as we wanted it. The plumber has been here about all day. Dewey is not feeling well tonight.

Sunday, July 14 Ther.: 80+ Nice day. Dewey sick all last night, but is feeling better tonight. Have been eating plums from one of our trees.

Monday, July 15

Worked some on pictures and developing. Mowed some weeds in the yard and took a photo of the house and one of the cow. Kate washed and did some canning.

Tuesday, July 16

A plumber came this morning and I have acted as his helped all day. We had a heavy wind and rain storm this afternoon.

Wednesday, July 17

Helped the plumber again today. We got the cook stove set up this forenoon and Kate has been using it for cooking and canning. We had a number of showers.

Thursday, July 18

Showery weather this forenoon, but more pleasant this afternoon. The plumber went away this forenoon. I marked up a lot of pictures and sent to Highlands.

Friday, July 19

More rain today. I got the pantry fixed so I made a small printing of postcards this afternoon.

Saturday, July 20

Still warm, muggy and showery. I mowed some weeds in the yard this forenoon. Spent the afternoon in writing and fixing up pictures.

Sunday, July 21

This has been the first day without rain in a month or more. Kate and I took a walk up by Mr. Hills place and around by the store calling on the Huggings.

Monday, July 22

Came to Hendersonville this morning and after doing errand and calling on Mrs. Jacobs, had dinner with Baker's and came on to Brevard tonight. There was a heavy storm this afternoon.

Tuesday, July 23

Was out at Beechnut Farm today and made some pictures. It threatened to rain and did sprinkle some. It is very warm weather.

Wednesday, July 24

This has been quite a nice day. Have been out making views of houses about town. Called at Raines boarding house this afternoon. Developed the exposed plates tonight.

Thursday, July 25

A warm, but pleasant day. I was busy most all day with the view work. Had a letter from Hiram and he feels some better.

Friday, July 26

Pleasant day. I made views at lawyer Zachery's new place and Mrs. Henry's. Tonight I took Lucy Raines and Daisy Burlingame to hear a violin recital, which was very good.

Saturday, July 27

I went to Rosman today to make some views for the Lumber Co. It continues to be pleasant weather.

Sunday, July 28

Took dinner today at Raines. Packed my grips and came home this afternoon. It has been a warm pleasant day.

Monday, July 29

Made a few postcards today and did some letter writing. There is lightning in the north tonight. It continues warm and dry.

Tuesday, July 30

Did a big printing of platinum paper today. Mr. Will Case drew tile from Hendersonville for our home drain. The sign of rain has passed off.

Wednesday, July 31

Cloudy all day and rain tonight. Dewy and I laid some tile to the house drain. I went to the storm and settled up to date with Mr. Case.

Thursday, August 1

This has been a pleasant day, and I did more printing on platinum paper. We are very busy with our picture business.

Friday, Aug. 2

A pleasant day. Mr Garrett began work on the poultry house. I made some postcard pictures this afternoon.

Saturday, Aug. 3

Made more postcards today. There was showers this afternoon, and tonight it storms hard.

Sunday, Aug. 4

It rained all last night and most of this morning. We stayed close at home all day. Dewey and I went to see how the field peas were coming on.

Monday, Aug. 5

This has been a fine day. I fixed up pictures and sent some away. The poultry house is going up nicely and will be an ornament to the place.

Tuesday, Aug. 6

The deputy sheriff came for me this morning and I had to go to Hendersonville. The case I was to identify photos on was not called, so I had nothing to do . Had dinner at Baker's. A letter from Mr. Hughes tells of Mrs. Hughes' death.

Wednesday, Aug. 7

Busy mounting, marking and doing up pictures. Mr. Marshall, the carpenter, called on us this afternoon and brought us some nice peaches. Had letter from Will and deed for Kate and I to sign.

Thursday, Aug. 8

Made postcards today. The telephone was installed in our house this afternoon. Mr. Garrett finished the hen house, and it is a fine one.

Friday, Aug. 9

Kate and I made a trip to Hendersonville to sign a deed before a Notary. We walked some and got rides with our neighbors, so the trip was not hard. We had dinner with Mrs. Jacobs. Mr. Garrett built our front roadway today.

Saturday, Aug. 10

Mr. Garrett made and hung the front gate this forenoon and I paid him in full for all his work. This afternoon I made a batch of postcards. It is very pleasant weather.

Sunday, Aug. 11

A very nice day. Kate and Dewey went to the Baptist Church. Mr. and Mrs. Jonathan Case took dinner and spent the afternoon with us.

Monday, Aug. 12

Dewey and I worked on the new hen house, getting a partition made. The plumber came out this afternoon to see what was needed to complete the work. I have been laying tile for the drain.

Tuesday, Aug. 13

Dewey went to Hendersonville with Mr. Gibbs today, and they got some piping and plumbers tools, but get no pump. Mr. Garrett was here and we put up some picture moulding. There was some rain this afternoon.

Wednesday, Aug. 14

Dewey and I built the hen yard today so Kate could let her pullets out for a run. I finished laying tile for the house drain. The air has been very clear.

Thursday, Aug. 15

Ther.: 80+

I painted the front steps this forenoon. The plumber came this afternoon and I have engaged Mr. Ward to bring out the pump tomorrow. Went over to Mr. Staton's and saw Mr. Garrett about coming to help tomorrow.

Friday, Aug. 16

This has been a busy day, and tonight we get water from the well by a pump. It is real warm weather.

Saturday, Aug. 17

The plumber finished his work here today, and we now have running water to bathroom, lavatory and kitchen. We will appreciate those conveniences.

Sunday, Aug. 18 Ther.: 82+

Kate and I attended the Baptist church this forenoon. It seemed pretty hot during the middle of the day.

Monday, Aug. 19

The warm weather continues. I find borers at work killing the pines in our grove and chopped one down and burned it all up. I made some postcards this afternoon.

Tuesday, Aug. 20

Worked at postcards all day. I has been very warm. We need a good shower here. They pass about us every day, but fail to get here.

Wednesday, Aug. 21

We had Mr. and Mrs. Garrett and two children at dinner with us today. They are attending a singing class at the Baptist church. We had a heavy wind and rain storm this afternoon.

Thursday, Aug. 22

Did a big day's work on postcards, making 220. There were some showers during the day. Kate and I called at the Marshalls this evening.

Friday, Aug. 23

Mounted some pictures and did some hoeing of trees and vines. Went to the Post Office with mail and wasted a lot of time.

Saturday, Aug. 24

Made some more postcards today. Painted part of the porch floor this evening. Do not feel just right tonight and have a headache.

Sunday, Aug. 25

A very fine day. We had water melon for dinner that our neighbors gave us, and this afternoon we went to Mr. Garrett's and had more melon and stayed to supper.

Monday, Aug. 26

Dewey and I cut up two more pines on the edge of the grove that had borers. This afternoon Dewey and I went to Hendersonville and got him a wheel which he rode home. I walked back this evening. Had a letter from Will and a draft to pay me off, so I do not own any more of the old home.

Tuesday, Aug. 27

Worked at photos again today. Kate and Dewey went to Mr. Marshall's and got grapes, from which she has been making grape juice.

Wednesday, Aug. 28

Did a printing on platinum paper today. It stays warm and dry weather.

Thursday, Aug. 29

Ther.: 80+

Made postcards. Finished working about the grape vines this evening. Warm and dry.

Friday, Aug. 30 Ther.: 82+

Did shop work all day. Our apples are wasting by dropping too soon.

Saturday, Aug. 31

Fixed up pictures to mail this forenoon. This afternoon I went to Hendersonville and on tonight to Tryon and am at Conners. It has been a hot day.

Sunday, Sept. 1

This forenoon I made a call at Howes and this afternoon Mr. Conner and I went over to Columbus and called on Mr. Hughes. We came back in the cool of the evening.

Monday, Sept. 2

Mr. Conner and I went to the Lemort vineyard this forenoon. They gave us some fine grapes. I came to Hendersonville and on home this afternoon.

Tuesday, Sept. 3

Continued hot weather. Kate and I made a call at Mr. Hills, our neighbor to the north, and we saw a sight on apple trees worth going far to see.

Wednesday, Sept. 4

Some clouds today but very warm most of the day. I went to Hendersonville to do some business at the bank, and to buy some furniture. It was a dusty, hot walk.

Thursday, Sept. 5

Did various jobs about the place. The furniture I got at Hendersonville came out today and adds to the house. I picked some apples this afternoon. They are dropping badly.

Friday, Sept. 6

Mowed some in the orchard this forenoon. Made postcards this afternoon. Went to Mr. Marshalls for grapes this evening.

Saturday, Sept. 7

Walked over to Hendersonville this morning and took the train to Lake Toxaway. I settled at the Inn for the selling of our pictures and it was a very small sum. Rode up to Sapphire with Mr. Crisp and then walked on to Fairfield and back to Mr. Burlingames, where I am staying all night.

Sunday, Sept. 8

Spent most of the day with Mr. Burlingame's folks. They have fine peaches, and I have had a feast of them. Walked to Lake Toxaway this evening, and got train to Brevard tonight and am at the Raine's.

Monday, Sept. 9

Did errands about Brevard today and got away on the afternoon train to Hendersonville, and so am home tonight.

Tuesday, Sept. 10

Did some looking about over the place this forenoon. We had a fine shower this afternoon, and the most brilliant rainbow I ever saw.

Wednesday, Sept. 11

It threatened rain this forenoon, but came off very beautiful this afternoon. Dewey and I went over to Mr. Hills where I tried to photograph some apple trees. Figgured up cost of our house to date and it is \$2455.00.

Thursday, Sept. 12

We cleaned out the basement this forenoon. Worked at pictures this afternoon. We expected Mr. and Mrs. Howes tomorrow, but had a letter telling that they could not come yet.

Friday, Sept. 13

There was many quite hard showers during today. I wrote several letters and mounted some pictures. A card from mother says she will start next Tuesday.

Saturday, Sept. 14

Did some mowing of weeds. Kate and I hung a few pictures this afternoon. Dewey rode his wheel to Hendersonville and back this afternoon.

Sunday, Sept. 15

Read and wrote this forenoon. Took a walk down toward Oleeta this afternoon and called on a Mr. Jackson who lives that way. It rained hard during last night, but was pleasant today.

Monday, Sept. 16

This forenoon I went to Mr. Hills to try again on pictures of apple trees. It has been a pleasant day. Did some printing this afternoon.

Tuesday, Sept. 17

Warm, bright day, and I made a printing on platinum paper. A letter from mother states she would start this morning, so we will look for her tomorrow.

Wednesday, Sept. 18

My 51st birthday. Dewey and I went to Hendersonville this morning with Mr. Gibbs, who brought mother's trunk and a load for us. Mother came through all right. I had a livery bring us home.

Thursday, Sept. 19

Mother seems to feel pretty well after her long journey. This afternoon I made a trail through the grove and up to the top of the hill back of the house. Began to cut cow fodder.

Friday, Sept. 20 Ther.: 46+, 74+

Real cool last night and this morning, so that a fire in the fireplace was nice. I printed a lot of platinum today but did not get it developed. Dewey rode his wheel to Hendersonville this forenoon.

Saturday, Sept. 21

It grew warmer today. I finished platinum prints this forenoon. Picked some apples this afternoon.

Sunday, Sept. 22

It began raining last night and has stormed all today. It is probably the equinoxtial. We have all stayed close at home all day.

Monday, Sept. 23

It drizzled more or less all day. I mounted up some paintings and fussed about with the pictures.

Tuesday, Sept. 24

I ran off two batches of postcards today, making 249 in all. It cleared off very nicely after noon, but we had one sharp shower toward evening.

Wednesday, Sept. 25

Kate went to Hendersonville today to have dental work done. After dinner I took my camera and kodak and walked to Sugar Loaf Mt. thinking it would be fine for views, but it turned hazy. I am at Salo Club House tonight.

Thursday, Sept. 26

I tried making a few views early this morning, then the clouds and fog came and spoiled my plans. Some men came up from Flat Rock in an Auto. I started for home this afternoon but it rained and I went back to the Beulah House.

Friday, Sept. 27

Loafed about all day thinking it would clear off and be good for picture work. I went up on the mountain toward evening and got in a slight shower. Tried to telephone the folks at home, but couldn't.

Saturday, Sept. 28

No prospect of fine weather so I came home this forenoon. Found Mrs. Burlingame here, but she left this afternoon. It did not rain today but was cloudy and hazy. Kate and I attended the Advent church tonight.

Sunday, Sept. 29

Considerably cooler, and we had a fire in the fireplace all day. There was a great singing at Refuge church today and crowds of people were there.

Monday, Sept. 30

Dewey and I picked apples this afternoon and put in the cellar. It has been cloudy and a little misty at times. There is a fall coolness in the air.

Tuesday, October 1

This has been a pleasant day. I went over to Hendersonville and settled up with Baker's Art Gallery. I walked both ways. Saw Mr. Garret about building a barn.

Wednesday, Oct. 2

Walked to Hendersonville this morning and got to Brevard at noon. This afternoon I made photo views at the Industrial School.

Thursday, Oct. 3

Been a fine day and I worked at getting views about all the time. I board at the Raines house.

Friday, Oct. 4

I went to Blantyre this forenoon to make a school photo. Walked back to Brevard as could not catch train. Had a card from Kate.

Saturday, Oct. 5

Was at Deer Lodge today making views. Had dinner at Allison's "Beechnut Farm." Took a cornfield photo for Mayor Breese this afternoon. Been a fine day.

Sunday, Oct. 6

I went up to Elk Lodge very early this morning and was about the fog. The scene was fine. Had a letter from Kate and wrote to her this afternoon. Went to church tonight.

Monday, Oct. 7

Was out all the forenoon making view and group photos about Davidson River and Pisgah Forest. I was warm and dusty walking.

Tuesday, Oct. 8

Was out this forenoon with Judge Shuford to a country home of his to make some views. Had dinner at Mr. Miner's.

Wednesday, Oct. 9

I walked out to the Clarke home this forenoon and spent most of the day there. They gave me a fine Automobile ride. I tried making some photos of their poultry.

Thursday, Oct. 10

I left Brevard this forenoon and came home, getting here at 1 o'clock. This afternoon we picked some apples and put in the cellar. All the fodder has been cut and a lot of it drawn.

Friday, Oct. 11

A fine day. Kate washed this forenoon. I made an order for fruit trees and ornamentals, and sent to Green's Nursery. This afternoon Billy Case drew cane fodder and I helped.

Saturday, Oct. 12

Another fine day. I made a batch of postcards. Had more hay drawn up and stacked it in the yard.

Sunday, Oct. 13

Rather cloudy all day with a few showers and raining tonight. Mr. Baker, Mrs. Barber and daughter, came out from Hendersonville and had dinner with us, spending the balance of the afternoon.

Monday, Oct. 14 Ther.: 54+

Rained all last night and a good bit of today. Kate did here washing in the basement as it was cool out of doors. I did developing, and made out an order for more apple trees.

Tuesday, Oct. 15 Ther.: 36+

I went to Lake Oceola beyond Hendersonville to try for some views. Called at Baker's Art Gallery a little while. Got back home a little after dark.

Wednesday, Oct. 16 Ther.: 36+

Pretty cool this morning, and there was a bit of frost on a small bridge. Mr. Thos. Grimshawe made us a pleasant call this afternoon. Kate and mother went to a missionary meeting this afternoon.

Thursday, Oct. 17 Ther.: 36+

Cool again this morning but no frost because of a heavy fog. Work on our new barn began today. I worked at making postcards and plain prints. Did some developing tonight.

Friday, Oct. 18

Warmer today, but still cool enough for a fire to be comfortable. Dewey and Hobart Case got up a load of wood. Men got the barn foundation laid today. It has looked rain all day.

Saturday, Oct. 19

It rained all last night and this forenoon. Kate expected to got to Hendersonville, but could not. There was beautiful cloud effects this afternoon.

Sunday, Oct. 20

It did not rain today but looked stormy a good bit. Mother and Kate attended Sunday School at Refuge Church this afternoon.

Monday, Oct. 21

Kate took Billy Case's horse and buggy and went to Hendersonville this forenoon for Mrs. Jacobs and Maude. I made a few photo postcards. Chopped down a quite large oak tree.

Tuesday, Oct. 22

It rained during last night and this morning, and has been cloudy all day. Trimed and mounted small paintings.

Wednesday, Oct. 23

It cleared up this morning. Kate and Dewey went with Mrs. Jacobs and Maude to Hendersonville, Horace Case taking them. The wind blew very hard this afternoon. Kate had her teeth fixed today.

Thursday, Oct. 24

Ther.: 36+

There was a gale all last night and today, but it is quieting down tonight. I printed platinum paper for some paintings. The barn frame is going up.

Friday, Oct. 25 Ther.: 40+, 60+

Shoveled dirt, mounted pictures, and did various things. Dewey and Hobart drew wood this afternoon till their wagon broke. It grew warmer, and has been a fine day.

Saturday, Oct. 26

Came to Brevard this forenoon expecting to take a group picture but the people had scattered. There has been heavy frost here.

Sunday, Oct. 27

There was frost good and white here this morning and I wonder if it was so at home. The day has been very nice. I took a walk with Lucy and Daisy this afternoon to Mt. Surprise.

Monday, Oct. 28

Came to Rosman last night, and this morning Mr. Henderson and I walked over the Blue Ridge to Old Toxaway, where I took the School group then we crossed the Ridge again to Quebec and made more school groups and then down to Rosman and got the school there in time to get train for Brevard.

Tuesday, Oct. 29

Went up to the gallery this morning and rinsed out the plates I developed last night. Came to Hendersonville on the forenoon train and had dinner with Baker's. Got out home this afternoon.

Wednesday, Oct. 30

I made 205 postcards today. The weather is beautiful. Got out the old phonograph and played all the records tonight. Kate got her book on poultry and is studying it.

Thursday, Oct. 31

Another fine day, but mist in the air tonight. I leveled the wood shed site, and put some sand in the shed part of the new barn.

Friday, November 1

There was a soaking rain last night and this morning. It has cleared off and grown cool. I worked at triming and mounting pictures. Kate, Dewey and I went and gathered our black walnuts.

Saturday, Nov. 2 Ther.: 32+

It turned cold and windy today and the carpenters quit work. I walked over to Hendersonville this afternoon and got Kate's new dress. It is going to freeze tonight.

Sunday, Nov. 3 Ther.: 24+

Hard freeze this morning. It has been pleasant all day and is not so cold tonight. I spent the day in reading and writing.

Monday, Nov. 4 Ther.: 20+

Colder yet this morning. Worked most of the day at fixing Calendars. I took some wheat up to the mill at the canning factory and had some graham flour made. Blanche and Horace Case took supper with us.

Tuesday, Nov. 5 Ther.: 32+

Warmer today. Worked at the Calendars again. I chopped a tree down for Dewey to work up into wood. This afternoon I planted some walnuts to try growing trees.

Wednesday, Nov. 6

It began raining last night and has rained all today. I made a large batch of postcards.

Thursday, Nov. 7

Rained all last night and there were showers this forenoon. Grew cooler this afternoon and cleared up. Mr. Garrett worked on the barn again. Made some more postcards.

Friday, Nov. 8

A very nice day. I went this morning and made a photo of the School house, and tried to get some interiors of the canning factory. Kate and I did some cleaning up in the back yard.

Saturday, Nov. 9

A windy day, so the carpenters failed to get the roof on the barn. Dewey left for Tryon on his wheel this forenoon. It seems lonesome without him, but expect we will have to get used to that.

Sunday, Nov. 10 Ther.: 30+, 60+

Wednesday, Nov. 13

I went to the canning factory this forenoon and tried again to secure an interior view. It became cloudy and windy today and there was a little rain this afternoon.

Thursday, Nov. 14 Ther.: 40+, 40+

Spent most of today doing odd jobs about the place. It grew cooler last night and has been a very clear day.

Friday, Nov. 15 Ther.: 32+

Cool and windy. Kate came home on the train from Tryon and walked from Hendersonville. Dewey rode a horse through that was given them.

Saturday, Nov. 16

Been a fine day. The new horse has been the all absorbing topic today, and Kate and mother took a buggy ride this afternoon. Dewey and I sawed up a small tree.

Sunday, Nov. 17 Ther.: 32+, 50+

Some cold this morning. I called at Jonathan Case's this forenoon, and took a walk over to the neighbors to the east of here this afternoon. The wind has blown some today.

Monday, Nov. 18 Ther.: 28+

Helped Kate some with the washing this forenoon. She and mother drove to Hendersonville this afternoon. The box of fruit trees and ornamentals came and I huled them into the ground. A nice day.

Tuesday, Nov. 19 Ther.: 24+

Quite frozen this morning. Spent most of the day in setting out the ornamental shrubs. The Garretts got the roof on the wood shed today. Dewey and Hobart sawed up a log for wood.

Wednesday, Nov. 20 Ther.: 32+

Quite a warm day after the sun got to work. I took the new horse to Hendersonville and got a new harness and wagon, and brought home a load of feed.

Thursday, Nov. 21 Ther.: 30+

Did a lot of digging about the barn and woodshed, so as to be able to put the wagon in the shed, and keep water from running in. I planted out the Peony roots this afternoon.

Friday, Nov. 22 Ther.: 34+, 50+

I started to print this morning, but it clouded up and I had to quit. This evening we are having our first snow of this winter. The carpenters finished their work this forenoon, and I paid all. Kate has a pen of poultry ready to take to Hendersonville tomorrow to the show.

Thursday, Nov. 28 Ther.: 26+

It snowed 2 or 3 inches last night, and blew a gale today, so Kate and Dewey did not go to Hendersonville with the poultry. We had a very good Thanksgiving dinner all by ourselves. I got the cow up to the new barn, but she does not feel at home.

Friday, Nov. 29 Ther.: 12+, 42+

Very cold morning, but has been a pleasant day. I finished up the printing I began day before yesterday. Kate and Dewey went to Hendersonville and took their coop of poultry. They came back tonight quite elated over getting some first prizes.

Saturday, Nov. 30 Ther.: 22+

Moderate weather again. I did more printing and finished all this afternoon. Kate and Dewey went after their poultry this afternoon and found a blue ribbon on the coop. A couple of young ladies took dinner with us.

Sunday, December 1

Cloudy most of today. Kate and I went to church this forenoon. It has grown warmer.

Monday, Dec. 2

Ther.: 40+, 60+

It rained last night and this forenoon. Mr. John Hill called this morning. I worked some at pictures.

Tuesday, Dec. 3 Ther.: 58+

Quite pleasant day. Have been busy most of day with pictures. Pruned the young grape vines this afternoon. Dewey went to Hendersonville and got a load of feed this afternoon.

Wednesday, Dec. 4 Ther.: 60+

A heavy rain last night and this forenoon. Worked with the pictures about all day. It is quite warm and feels like more rain tonight.

Thursday, Dec. 5 Ther.: 62+

Been raining more or less all day. Dewey and I drove up to the canning factory and got a box of fruit trees that came from Stark Bros., and I unpacked and heeled them in.

Friday, Dec. 6 Ther.: 66+

Heavy rain last night. Worked at pictures a good while today. Mother, Kate and Dewey took a ride this afternoon. Been real warm and we had doors open.

Saturday, Dec. 7

Worked at the pictures most of the day. The new washing machine came and Dewey and I drove up to the store and got it this afternoon.

Sunday, Dec. 8 Ther.: 34+

Kate and mother went to church this forenoon. Had a bit of headache and took a sleep to wear it off. It has grown cooler and squalls of snow and rain tonight.

Monday, Dec. 9

Kate used her new washing machine this forenoon, and it seems to work well. It has turned cold and windy.

Tuesday, Dec. 10 Ther.: 27+

Kate and I drove to Hendersonville this forenoon. We had dinner at Baker's. WE came home by what is called the Auto Road. It is hard going, and the mare made hard work for herself and me too. It looks stormy again.

Wednesday, Dec. 11

Cloudy all day and did sprinkle once. Kate and mother attended the Missionary meeting this afternoon.

Thursday, Dec. 12 Ther.: 22+, 30+, 22+ A cold, windy day. I put pine straw as a winter cover over the strawberry plants. It took considerable work to keep up fires in the house.

Friday, Dec. 13 Ther.: 13+, 38+, 28+

Pretty cold this morning, and it looked like a coming snow, but cleared up and was a fine winter day. Sawed some wood and did some planning about the orchard.

Saturday, Dec. 14 Ther.: 16+, 46+, 30+

Some warmer today. I printed a batch of platinums today. Had orders for more calendars from University, Va.

Sunday, Dec. 15 Ther.: 22+, 52+

A very pleasant day. Mrs. Mitchell and two children were here to dinner. Kate and I located a place for strawberry beds near the house.

Monday, Dec. 16 Ther.: 36+

Been warmer today. I went up on King Mountain this forenoon and took some views looking over our home to make postcards of. Been working at Calendars this afternoon. Developed plates tonight.

Tuesday, Dec. 17 Ther.: 52+

I made a lot of postcards from the negatives I made yesterday. Billy Case came and plowed some for a road and some terraces in the fields. Kate and mother are fixing up Christmas things.

Wednesday, Dec. 18

We have been doing up pictures and bundles to send away for Christmas. It rained some last night and today, but is turning cooler this evening. I had a little talk with Hiram Glover over the phone. He was at Baker's, on the way to Brevard.

Thursday, Dec. 19 Ther.: 30+, 36+, 24+

Grown colder, but it has been quite pleasant all day. Billy Case has been plowing for the strawberry bed and some more terraces. We sent off a lot of packages by mail for Christmas.

Friday, Dec. 20 Ther.: 20+, 50+, 36+

Cold this morning. I made a good sized printing of postcards. Dewey drove over town and got a load of feed this afternoon. Kate and I joined the Farmers Union here tonight.

Saturday, Dec. 21 Ther.: 28+, 48+

Did up many packages and mailed them off today. It is looking stormy tonight, but has been a pleasant day.

Sunday, Dec. 22

It has been dull and stormy looking some of today. Wrote, read and rested all day.

Monday, Dec. 23

Kate and Dewey went to Hendersonville this morning to meet Hiram and Leora, and they all had to face a cold east storm of rain and sleet coming home. I sent off a lot of packages this afternoon.

Tuesday, Dec. 24 Ther.: 32+, 28+, 30+

Everything out doors covered with ice this morning. Sawed wood, visited, and chored about all day. There were Christmas exercises at the school house this afternoon to which all went except Hiram and I.

Wednesday, Dec. 25 Ther.: 22+

We found our stockings pretty well filled as they hung on the fireplace mantle this morning. It has been a bright, fine day. Cards and packages came by mail. We had a good dinner and oranges and candy.

Thursday, Dec. 26 Ther.: 32+, 40+

It began showering early this morning and has been a gloomy day. Hiram and I managed to get in a little walk this forenoon. I called on Mr. Ward this afternoon to ask him about his land that joins ours.

Friday, Dec. 27 Ther.: 42+, 24+

Warm this morning but grew cold and windy this afternoon. Hiram and I looked all over the ward place this forenoon. We went to Oleela Falls this afternoon.

Saturday, Dec. 28 Ther.: 24+
